

2011 COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS PROGAM (CAP) PROJECT INFORMATION MARCH 2011

The National Spatial Data Infrastructure (NSDI) represents a broad consortium of government agencies and non-government organizations that work together to promote more cost-effective production, ready availability, and greater utilization of geospatial data across a wide range of disciplines. The NSDI Cooperative Agreements Program (CAP) was established by the Federal Geographic Data Committee (FGDC) to help form partnerships among organizations to implement the NSDI.

The FGDC sponsors the CAP to promote the technologies, standards, best practices and organizational collaboration vital to data integration, partnerships for data investment and speedy delivery of geospatial products to support government. Since 1994 the CAP has provided funding and assistance to over 600 organizations implementing the NSDI. The program's goal is to encourage resource-sharing projects through the use of technology, networking, and more efficient inter-organizational coordination. For the 2011 CAP over \$750,000 was provided to 20 organizations in six funding categories.

CATEGORY 1: Metadata Trainer and

Outreach Assistance provides assistance to organizations with NSDI expertise knowledge and experience in assisting other organizations with the training and implementation of metadata. The projects listed are funded up to \$25,000 each.

The states listed are funded up to \$50,000 each.
