A-16 Supplemental Guidance

- Review and comments by Steering Committee received 5/14/2010
 - Comments reviewed and incorporated
 - Extensive consistency check within, and between, Supplemental and reference materials
- Final concurrences due by 6/30/2010
- ♦ As of 6/22, 15 concurrences
- Document to OMB early June



Geospatial Line of Business Update

- Resources/materials realigned to support establishment of the Geospatial Platform
- Strong correlation between GeoLoB and Geospatial Platform requirements
- GeoLoB 2011 efforts will have a strong focus on advancing the Geospatial Platform







FGDC Governance Activities

- Establishment of a National Digital Orthophoto Programs (NDOP) FGDC Subcommittee
 - Draft charter in review
 - Establishes the NDOP Subcommittee as an entity of the FGDC
 - Responsible for developing, promoting, and executing a national strategy that acquires or accesses orthoimagery data for Federal agencies while creating and using partnerships with State, local, tribal, and private organizations.
 - July Coordination Group approval vote planned

 - Press Release/Federal Register Notice
 - FGDC/agency mail lists
 - Partner/stakeholder distribution
- Nominations will be evaluated by interagency panel using common criteria
- Recommendations will be provided to DOI Secretary
- Secretary Salazar will appoint NGAC members
 - Next appointments will take effect January, 2011
 - Under NGAC Charter, appointment terms are 3 years

Draft Appointments Timeline

Date	Action
June/July 2010	Call for Nominations (Open for 45 days)
August	Compilation/analysis of nominations – distribution to Interagency Review Panel
Aug./Sept.	Review Panel – evaluation of nominees & development of recommendations to DOI Office of the Secretary
October	Appointments package submitted to Office of Secretary
December:	Appointments approved/signed
January 28, 2011	New appointments take effect



Nomination Process

- Nominations may be submitted on behalf of others, or individuals may self-nominate
 - Nominations should include:
 - A nomination letter summarizing the nominee's qualifications and interest in NGAC membership and describing the nominee's ability to represent a stakeholder group
 - A biographical sketch, resume, or vita
 - One letter of reference and a list of two additional references with contact information
 - Contact information for the nominee (name, title, organization, mailing address, e-mail address, and phone number)



Draft Review Criteria

*Based on 2009 Review Criteria

General Criteria:

- Committee membership should reflect a balanced representation of the viewpoints of the diverse interests involved in national geospatial activities and the development of the NSDI
- Committee membership should reflect geographic balance and experience with multiple sectors of the geospatial community

Specific Criteria:

- Members should effectively represent a constituency or community of interest
- Members should have a record of significant accomplishment and be recognized and respected within their fields
- Members should be able to speak authoritatively on geospatial matters and communicate complex issues to a broad audience in a simple manner
 - Members should have a collaborative, consensus-building approach
