

Executive Summary:

The objective of the Colorado State University Health Physics Fellowship program is to support two students each year in the health physics master's program for the duration of the funding. The benefit to the NRC will be the availability of a pool of health physicists that are comprehensively educated in radiation safety for hiring into the NRC and industry. Should the graduates be employed in industry, they would help to ease the regulatory burden by virtue of their understanding of health physics and the underpinnings of the regulations promulgated by the NRC.
