Dear Kathie:

On behalf of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission staff, I am writing to request that ASTM coordinate the development of an ASTM provisional safety standard for safety vacuum release devices to be used with swimming pools, wading pools, spas, and hot tubs.

A CPSC staff study conducted several years ago noted thirteen incidents of disembowelment (evisceration) in public wading pools between 1980 and 1986 and two additional incidents since 1990, most involving children between two and six years of age. The CPSC staff was not aware of any deaths associated with disembowelment, however, the damage is irreversible and has a devastating effect on the child's future health and development. The staff was also aware of nine cases of body entrapment in pools and spas, seven of which resulted in death, between January 1990 and May 1996. The deaths were the result of drowning after the body or a limb was held against the drain by the suction of the circulation pump.

In order to eliminate or reduce these losses, some code groups are now requiring the use of vacuum relief devices which shut down the circulation pump when abnormal suction is detected; however, no safety standards currently exist for such devices. It is requested that a new ASTM national consensus safety standard be developed by the ASTM F-15 Committee on Consumer Products using the fast track provisional standard procedures.
