**UNITED TECHNOLOGIES CORPORATION'S
UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR A FURTHER EXTENSION OF TIME
TO SEEK *IN CAMERA* TREATMENT OF DOCUMENTS**




United Technologies Corporation ("UTC") hereby moves for a further extension time to file a motion for *in camera* treatment of documents it has produced in the above-referenced matter. UTC is a third party to these proceedings and has cooperated and continues to cooperate with both the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") and MSC Software Corporation ("MSC") by producing documents totaling almost 2,000 pages. Out of this number, Complaint Counsel and Counsel for MSC have identified approximately 550 pages as potential trial exhibits. On June 4, 2002, UTC filed its Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to Seek *In Camera* Treatment of Documents. UTC requested this extension to allow the individuals at UTC most familiar with the documents produced the opportunity to review the documents identified as potential trial exhibits for information that

2002 deadline. Therefore, UTC requests a ten-day extension until June 28, 2002 of the deadline by which it may file a possible motion for *in camera* treatment pursuant to Commission Rule of Practice 3.45. UTC notes that Boeing Company has been granted an extension until June 21, 2002 to file its motion for *in camera* treatment, and UTC seeks a marginal extension beyond that date.

Counsel for UTC has discussed this motion for an extension of time with Complaint Counsel and Counsel for MSC, who do not oppose it. Neither Complaint Counsel nor Counsel for MSC waives the right to oppose a motion by UTC for *in camera* treatment of specific documents if such a motion is in fact filed.

Granting UTC's motion will result in the efficient administration of justice. This extension will permit UTC and the parties to this litigation the opportunity to reach a mutually agreeable solution as to how to treat the sensitive information contained in these six documents. Further discussions may allow the parties to agree on suitable redactions that will protect UTC's proprietary information and information that UTC is obliged to withhold unless permission is granted by the DoD. If UTC's deadline is not extended, it might result in a motion seeking *in camera* treatment and a further application for DoD permission, which could result in even greater delays.
