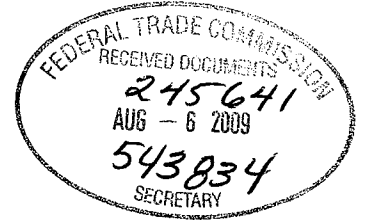

RESPONDENT CARILION CLINIC TO RESPOND TO THE COMPLAINT**


Respondent Carilion Clinic through counsel, hereby requests a thirty day extension for Respondent to respond to the Complaint. In support of this motion, Respondent states that:


