Wing Exercise-Ready 230 Airmen go to Operational Readiness Exercise

The wing's pending challenge is our Operational Readiness Exercise, and it begins here at the New Castle Air National Guard Base on August 3.

That's when our advance echelon team, or ADVON, departs for Alpena, Mich., home of the ANG Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center, where they will perform initial site setup tasks prior to the main body of personnel who follow on August 4.

The Airmen will travel aboard C-130 and C-17 military aircraft to Michigan, and are expected to return home in two groups on August 8 and 9.

The purpose of the ORE is to promote excellence in training in an atmosphere that purposely contains enough unpredictability to stress the mind and body, while testing teamwork and pushing members' ability to survive and operate while performing our mission in a combat environment.

Major Robert Howard, installation deployment officer, 166th Logistics Readiness Squadron, said about 230 Airmen from the wing will be joined at the ORE by about the same number of Airmen from our ANG sister unit, the 117th Air Refueling Wing in Birmingham, Ala. In addition, about 40 Exercise Evaluation Team members from various units will deploy to give guidance and evaluate the combined deployed wing.

The 166th AW is the lead unit for this ORE, with dozens of full-time members and many more part-time members

spending considerable time sharpening their skills and checking details.

Speaking of the wing preparations, Maj. Howard said, "We are as good as we can be at this point. Everybody is trained, ready to go, and now we just need to execute."

His advice to younger troops? "Listen and learn from those with experience, and get into your AFIs [Air Force Instructions]," said Maj. Howard. "We are in the crawl phase of crawl -- walk -- run. It is time to learn and fix mistakes."

EET members will provide classroom training for a couple days at the Alpena CRTC, then evaluate our capabilities for chemical and wartime readiness.

The wing safety office reminds us

that the mission comes first and safety is always paramount.

Senior Master Sgt. Bob Ward, wing safety NCOIC, said, "Each Airman, whether on the ground or in the air, needs to speak up if you see something unsafe, or that looks or feels incorrect. It is always the right time to complete a task safely, exercise or no exercise."

The wing will have another ORE, currently scheduled to occur September 2013, at the Gulfport CRTC in Miss.

The OREs are preparation for the Operational Readiness Inspection scheduled for June 2014 with over 300 wing Airmen participating.

The wing's last ORI was March-April 2009 and held at the Alpena CRTC.

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AMC Commander to visit

The commander of the 166th Airlift Wing's gaining command will visit our base on August 2. Highlights from his biography follow.

General Raymond E. Johns Jr. is Commander, Air Mobility Command, Scott Air Force Base, Ill. AMC's mission is to provide rapid, global mobility and sustainment for America's armed forces. The command plays a crucial role in providing humanitarian support at home and around the world. The men and women of AMC - active duty, Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve and civilians - provide airlift, aerial refueling, special air mission and aeromedical evacuation.

General Johns graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1977. His aviation career includes T-38 and C-141 instructor pilot, as well as the chief test pilot and test program manager for the

VC-25 Air Force One Replacement Program. He was chosen as a White House Fellow in 1991 where he was a senior staff member in the Office of National Service. The general has served at Headquarters U.S. European Command in security assistance and congressional affairs, and at Headquarters U.S. Pacific Command as Deputy Director of Strategic Plans and Policy. Within Headquarters U.S. Air Force, he served as Deputy Director and, later, Director of Air Force Programs. The general commanded a test squadron, operations group and airlift wing, and he was the Director of Mobility Forces for operations in Bosnia.

Prior to assuming his current position, Gen. Johns served as Deputy Chief of Staff for Strategic Plans and Programs, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C., where he developed, integrated, evaluated and analyzed the U.S. Air Force Future Years Defense Program that exceeded \$822 billion, and the Air Force Long-Range Plan to

support national security objectives and military strategy. The general was responsible to the Secretary of the Air Force and the Chief of Staff. Gen. Johns is a command pilot and experimental test pilot with 4,500 flying hours in a variety of aircraft.

Major Gen. Broomall retires

A military ceremony on base at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 5, marks the conclusion of the uniformed career of Maj. Gen. Hugh T. Broomall, the Special Assistant to the Director, Air National Guard. Highlights from his biography follow.

General Broomall was commissioned in November 1974 through the Academy of Military Science, Mc-Ghee Tyson ANG Base, Tenn. Prior to receiving his commission, Gen. Broomall served as an enlisted member in the Delaware ANG. Following his commissioning, Gen. Broomall attended the Department of Defense Armed Forces Intelligence Officer Course at Lowry Air Force Base and upon graduation was assigned as Air Intelligence Officer.

General Broomall has commanded the 166th Support Group, Delaware ANG. Gen. Broomall was selected by Delaware's U.S. Senator William V. Roth to serve in 1997 a member of the Congressional Fellowship Program and was a primary military staff officer supporting the United States Senate North Atlantic Treaty Organization Observer Group. Gen. Broomall also served as the National Guard Bureau U.S. Property and Fiscal Officer for Delaware.

Prior to his current assignment, Gen. Broomall served as the Assistant Adjutant General-Air, Delaware National Guard and was also dual-hatted as Assistant to the Director, ANG.
