http://www.auerdult.de/englisch.html Tradition-seekers still running on Oktoberfest momentum will enjoy the annual Kirchweihdult on Mariahilfplatz from October 20-28. From 9 am-7 pm each day, more than 290 stands will offer sweets, treats and libations, as well as used books, antiques and perhaps Europe's largest selection of kitchen utensils.

The Auer Dult is characteristic of Munich, the Bavarian capital. The history of the popular fair with its folkloric flair can be traced back to the Middle Ages. Nowadays the event is organized by the Munich Tourist Office. Three times a year, the locals flock to the Mariahilfplatz, in the part of town called the

"Au", which means "meadow" or "pasture": here they can walk around at leisure, shop for bargains, have a bite to eat and enjoy a good time. During the "Dult", the fairground, which spreads over 20,000 square meters, becomes an island in the heart of the city, alive with conversation and congeniality. Children young and old enjoy going on the bumper cars, the boat-like swings, the merry-go-round or the Ferris wheel.

And if you like Punch and Judy, you must go see their Bavarian cousin, the famous " Kasperl von der Au". The Auer Dult is Europe's largest market for tableware and all kinds of pots and pans. New-fangled household products are proudly praised as "kitchen marvels". The junk dealers' wares conceal many a treasure, sometimes art

and sometimes kitsch. Whether glass or porcelain, wax or wicker, cloth or leather, whether it's candy or an oldfashioned herbal remedy you're looking for: your heart's desire awaits you at the Dult. This is open-air shopping with a smile. And if you have children, be sure to go on "Kindertag", when you are able to get more for less. Despite the nonreligious orientation of the Auer Dult, the Mariahilf Church will also participate in the fair. Each day, the church will offer free guided tours up to the church tower, where the new carillon (a very special type of a glockenspiel) will be on

The carillon will play melodies by contemporary composers on special holidays throughout the year. The guided tours will be offered at 2 pm, 3 pm and 4 pm on weekdays. Each Sunday, there will be an additional tour at 11 am.

# MIRCHWEIN

21 October is Kirchweih Sunday. It is the anniversary of the day the Church was dedicated or consecrated. In the old days each little village church had their own "Kirchweih" with very extensive celebrations. About 300 years ago the Duke of Bavaria decided that there was entirely too much frolicking going on and that it was definitely interfering with the work in and around town. So he decreed that all church dedicating anniversaries be held on the same day throughout the country. Folks could celebrate to their hearts content and then be done with it.



He chose the day to be the third Sunday in October. All farmers would have their harvest in, the hay in the barns and the animals back in the stables. Finally a time for the farmers, their families and workers to relax and celebrate. Of course after a year of hard work one day just wasn't enough for celebrations, especially since most of the days' celebrations took place in church. So Monday was added and in some villages celebrations are said to have lasted until Wednesday! In many towns and villages you will find signs on shop doors that tell you "Kirchweih Montag ab 12h geschlossen" which means the stores will close at noon on Monday 22 October.

It was always a holiday farm workers were looking forward to because it meant a year of hard work was finished for the season and it was now time to dance, eat and drink. Many places downtown Garmisch offer Kirchweih dinner – which is of course goose – and Kirchweih Tanz - which is the dance after dinner. If you are interested, stop by the office and I tell you which places offer dinner and dance.

People even walked about 20 miles back to their own village for Kirchweih to be with the families.

The Kirchweih fest is announced by festive bell ringing early in the morning. The yellow flag with the white cross greets parishioners from the church steeples. Most of Sunday is occupied by church services and eating. Sunday night called for bowling, shooting competitions and dancing into the night.

The village of Unterammergau revived a custom called "Kirta" = Kirchweih singing. This custom was established in 1836 after the village burned down the second time after 1777. The fires most likely were started by cooking and frying for Kirchweih. To remind villagers to handle their fires carefully, the night watch man and a group of whetstone cutters (whetstone cutting was a small industry in Unterammergau in the old days) in their traditional garb sing their warning throughout the village the evening before Kirchweih. It usually begins at 2000 on Saturday (20 Oct) before Kirchweih. They stop at 9 different houses to sing the warning, ending in church.

Kirchweih is celebrated to this day. Kirchweih dances are held over the weekend and almost all restaurants serve crispy roast goose with steaming potato dumplings and red cabbage and for dessert fresh



Kirchweih fritters. Kirchweihkrapfen are known to you as donuts. The unusual form of these donuts is the "Auszogne" – donuts that have been pulled from the middle to form a rim around a very thin center and then deep fried. All bakeries will have them as a special offer during the next couple of weeks...
