

LOCAL ESTIMATES OF RESIDENT INDIAN POPULATION AND LABOR FORCE STATUS: JANUARY 1985

INTRODUCTION

Coverage & Definitions: The term "resident Indian" means Indians living on Federal reservations or nearby who are considered part of the service population of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The term "near reservations" as defined in CFR 25 par. 20.1 (r), means those areas or communities adjacent or contiguous to reservations which are designated by the operational head of the Bureau upon recommendation of the local Bureau Superintendent, which recommendations shall be based upon consultation with the tribal governing body of those reservations as locales appropriate for the extension of financial assistance and/or services, on the basis of such general criteria as: (1) number of Indian people native to the reservation residing in the area; (2) a written designation of the tribal governing body that members of their tribe and family members who are Indian residing in the area, are socially, culturally and economically affiliated with their tribe and reservation; (3) geographical proximity of the area to the reservation, and (4) administrative feasibility of providing an adequate level of services to the area.

Special legislation governs eligibility in Alaska and Oklahoma, as defined in CFR 25 par. 20.20. Essentially these conditions mean that (1) the applicant must be an Indian, except that in the States of Alaska and Oklahoma a one-fourth degree or more Indian or Native blood quantum will be an additional eligibility requirement; and (2) the applicant must reside on a reservation; or (3) the applicant must reside near reservation as specifically defined in par. 20.1(r). In Alaska the figures include all Alaska Natives, i.e. Aleuts, Eskimos, as well as Indians. Since very few are actually living on reservation, the term "nearby" refers to all the rest of Alaska. In Oklahoma, the area covered encompasses former reservations. Thus, in both states the Bureau's responsibility extends almost entirely to the total Indian population of those states.

The statistics compiled herein refer basically to the population of a geographic area; they do not necessarily refer to tribal membership. Such figures are maintained by the individual tribes according to their specific rules of membership, which may include Indian members wherever they may be living.

The total of approximately 786,000 Indians covered in these tables represents slightly more than half of the Indian population of the United States, which in the 1980 U.S. census numbered 1.4 million including Eskimos and Aleuts. The remainder consists of members of Federally recognized tribes who live off-reservation, or Indian people who are not members of any Federally recognized tribe, or those who claimed Indian ancestry.

Estimated Figures: The local Agency offices of the Bureau of Indian Affairs estimate the data using whatever information may be available for the reservation. Accuracy varies from place to place; it is relatively high at small, isolated locations where everyone's activity is common knowledge. On the

other hand, the resident Indian service population count, as well as the labor force status can be difficult to estimate for Alaska, Oklahoma, and the Navajo reservation where Indians are scattered over enormous geographic areas. Although, household surveys of residency and labor force status are conducted, they are infrequent because of the considerable cost that such procedures demand.

Labor Force Status: Considered in this category are all those 16 years old and over (507,833) representing about 65% of the total population. This category is divided into three major groups for the purposes of this estimate--unable to work, employed, and able to work but not employed.

(1) Unable to work (column 5 and 6). The total 152,369, or almost a third of those 16 years old and over, includes those who are prevented from working by attending school, caring for children, or unable to work by reasons of disability, retirement, or age. Students make up some 41% of this group. However, individual reservations differ in the proportion estimated to fall into this category.

(2) Employed (column 7). The total, 179,564 or 35% of those 16 years old and over includes full-time and part-time employees. Of those close to 60% earn \$7,000 or more (column 8)--the \$7,000 figure being based on the annual income of a worker earning minimum wage. In other words, more than one-third of the employed are earning less than the minimum wage for a full-time job. This represents a slight increase from the previous reporting period. It could be argued that employment, excluding marginal jobs, provides a better picture of the economic health of a reservation than the total employment. As one possible index of this condition, column 9 shows the number of employed Indians earning \$7,000 or more as a percent of a labor force which is in the 16 to 65 population range (column 4 minus column 2).

(3) Not employed but able to work (column 10). The total, 175,900, or 35% of those 16 years old and over, includes persons actually seeking work and those not seeking work. This distinction underlies two concepts of labor force: (a) The "potential labor force" consisting of all those 16 years old and over who are able to work, whether employed or not (columns 7 and 10 totaling 355,464). Forty-nine percent of the "potential labor force" are not employed (column 11); (b) those not seeking work and who are omitted from the standard Labor Department definition of labor force and unemployed. By the latter definition the labor force consists of columns 7 and 12, totaling 295,438 and the unemployment rate is 39 percent (column 13). [NOTE: Unlike the national statistics, we include persons not seeking work, because of difficulty of estimating this group without expensive surveys. There are also problems in developing a useful concept of those seeking work in places where few jobs are available, as on many reservations. In any case, including persons not wanting work in the labor force results in a higher unemployment rate than would be found in a standard household survey].

**Table Format:** The basic data is compiled in Table 3. They are arranged by BIA Area Offices and within Area, by Agency or equivalent unit of organization below the Area level, the Reservation, and State.

Table 1 and 2 are summary tables. The former shows the totals for each State. The latter shows totals for each of the areas into which the BIA is administratively divided.

**Additional Comments:** In the compilation of this Labor Force Report, a conscious effort was made to present as accurately as possible the resident Indian population on and near reservations. It should be noted, however, that there are problems with statistics on Indian reservations. The collection of statistics in Indian urban areas is particularly difficult since household surveys are infrequent or non-existent. Also in isolated rural areas, it is difficult to separate the job-seekers from those not seeking jobs because there are not jobs available to draw out this distinction. Were jobs available, the unemployment rate would probably be somewhere between the two measures given in this report notably 39 percent and 49 percent. These rates while extremely high by any standard show some improvement from the last reporting period, which probably reflects the national trend.
