What is cciToolsforFeds.org?

cciToolsforFeds.org is a one-stop online resource for Federal staff who plan and manage comprehensive community initiatives (CCls)—efforts to improve the lives of youth and families through systems change. CCls are also known as community change initiatives.

Who should use the Web site?

The Web site is designed primarily for Federal staff. It may be useful also to technical assistance providers, evaluators, private funders, and community groups.

- Answers to key questions.

- Checklists to assist with key activities.

When should I use cciToolsforFeds.org?

When you need to-

- Write solicitations for CCI projects.
- Plan budgets for CCI projects.
- Select and orient CCI project sites.
- Construct and nurture cross-agency funding partnerships in support of CCI projects.
- Develop and fund systems for technical assistance to CCI project sites.
- Create appropriate evaluations for CCI projects.
- Adapt tools that others have found useful in developing CCI projects and supporting CCI project sites.
- Increase the number of CCI project sites that achieve successful outcomes.
- Increase the number of CCI project sites that successfully transition from Federal funding to self-support.
