SUBJECT: Guidance for Title 10 USC 2853 Notifications – Authorized Cost and Scope of Work Variations Related to the FY 2011 Military Construction Authorizations and Appropriations

COMPTROLLERS OF THE DEFENSE AGENCIES COMPTROLLERS OF THE DOD FIELD ACTIVITIES

This memorandum provides the guidance regarding the application of Authorized Cost and Scope of Work Variations (Title 10 U.S.C. 2853) to the Military Construction Authorizations and Appropriations in FY 2011. It explains which baseline to use for calculating cost and scope changes.

The Department of Defense and Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2011, (Public Law 112-10, Div. B) provided less funding than the amount requested in the FY 2011 President's Budget and authorized in the FY 2011 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). The Department reevaluated the FY 2011 program and assessed the impact of the lower funding levels. On June 29, 2011, the Department submitted a spend plan to Congress identifying the projects to be funded at a level of detail below the account level as required by section 2001 of Public Law 112-10.

The following guidance is provided for applying the reporting requirements specified in Title 10 USC 2853 to the baseline established by the spend plan:

 Subsection 2853(a) requires the Secretary concerned to notify Congress when the cost authorized for a military construction project or for the construction, improvement, and acquisition of a military family housing project is *increased or decreased by more than*

- 25 percent of the amount appropriated for such project or 200 percent of the minor construction project ceiling specified in Title 10 Section 2805(a)(1). For military construction projects authorized in Division B of the FY 2011 NDAA, the amounts identified in the spend plan for each project will serve as the basis for this calculation.
- Subsection 2853(b)(1) requires the Secretary concerned to notify Congress when the scope of work for a military construction or family housing projects are reduced by more than 25 percent as outlined in the justification data provided to Congress with the President's Budget. DoD Components will continue to base scope reduction reporting on the justification material submitted with the FY 2011 President's Budget.

Cost variation notices provided pursuant to subsection 2853(a), as well as reprogrammings under Volume 3 of the DoD Financial Management Regulation, will be based on amounts set forth in the spending plan, whereas scope reductions pursuant to subsection 2853(b)(1) are based on NDAA authorizations.
