






















## BY THE NUMBERS

U.S. Army Europe's presence on the continent builds the political and popular support among our European allies vital to helping abate regional security threats and worldwide aggression.

The relationships we build with our European partners during 350 theater security cooperation events in 42 countries each year leads to trust and compatibility for military operations such as in Iraq, Afghanistan, and in recent support to operations in Libya.

By 2015 U.S. Army Europe will have transformed to 30,000 Soldiers, at five communities, in a mix of heavy, Stryker and airborne brigade combat teams combined with key theater support elements. This full-spectrum balance ensures U.S. Army Europe remains capable, effective and able to address and prevent current and future security challenges.
