IRON CONSTRUCTION CASTINGS FROM BRAZIL, CANADA, AND CHINA

DETERMINATIONS

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (Commission) determines, pursuant to section 751(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)) (the Act), that revocation of the countervailing duty order on heavy iron construction castings from Brazil, the antidumping duty order on heavy iron construction castings from Canada, and the antidumping duty orders on iron construction castings from Brazil and China would lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to the industries in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted these reviews on May 3, 2010 (75 FR 23295) and determined to conduct expedited reviews of the countervailing duty and antidumping duty orders pursuant to section 751(c)(3) of the Act (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)(3)).

The Commission transmitted its determinations in these reviews to the Secretary of Commerce on October 27, 2010. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 4191 (October 2010), entitled *Iron Construction Castings from Brazil, Canada, and China* (Inv. Nos. 701-TA-249 and 731-TA-262, 263, and 265 (Third Review)).
