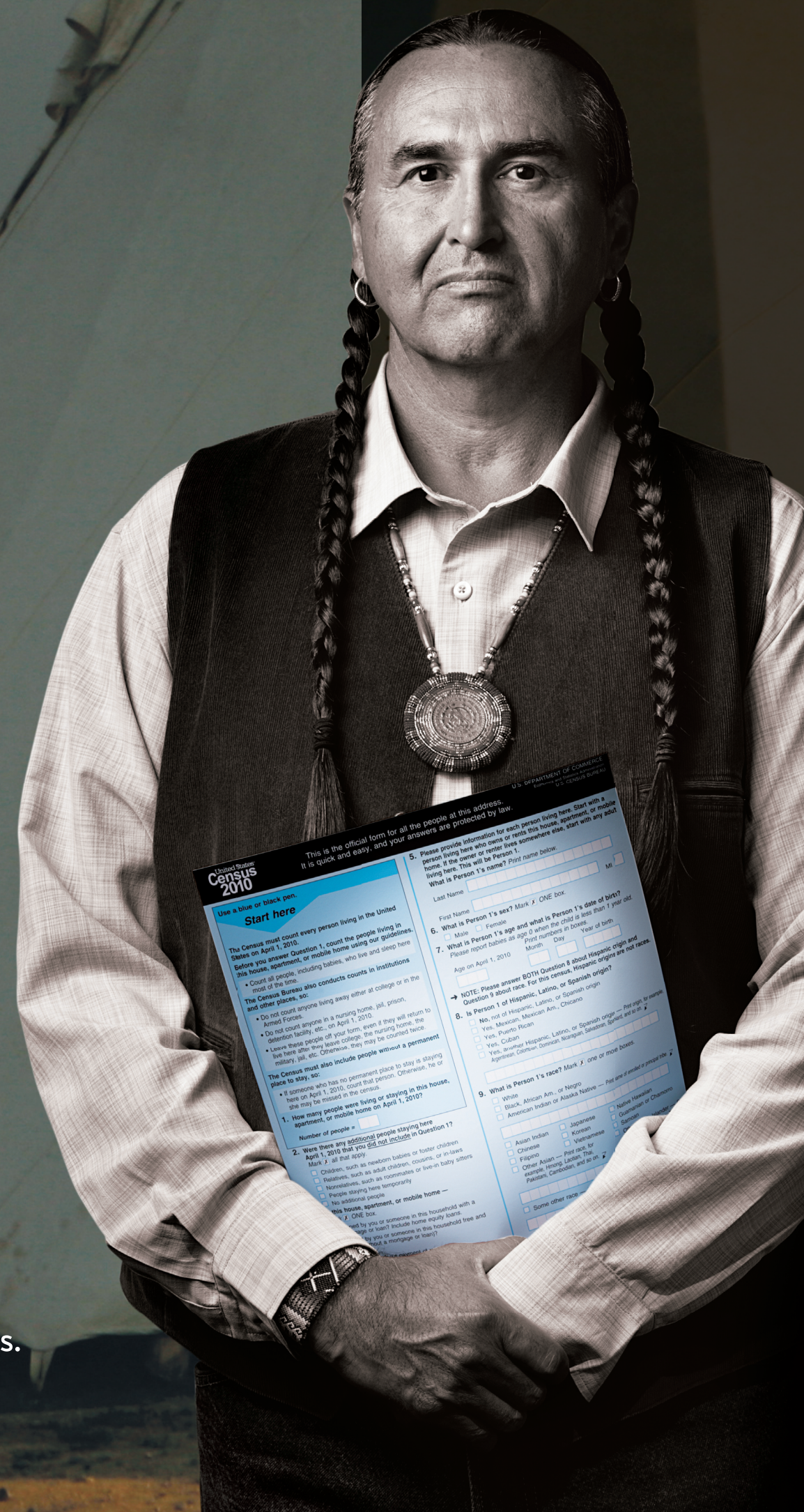

This is the official form for all the people at this address. It is quick and easy, and your answers are protected by law.

Start here

The Census must count every person living in the United States on April 1, 2010. Count the people living in this house, apartment, or mobile home unless you live in a college, university, or other institution.

Count all people, including babies, who live and sleep here most of the time.

The Census Bureau also conducts counts in institutions such as:

- Do not count anyone living away from home, at college or in the Armed Forces.
- Do not count anyone in a nursing home. If they will return to their family, etc., on April 1, 2010, count them here.
- Leave these people on your form, even if they are not living here: people who have been charged with a crime but are not in jail; people who are in a psychiatric hospital; people who are in a nursing home; people who are in a long-term care facility; people who are in a residential care facility; people who are in a residential care facility; people who are in a residential care facility.

The Census must also include people without a permanent address to stay, so:

- If someone who has no permanent place to stay is staying with you on April 1, 2010, count that person. Check the box on the form.
- If many people were living or staying in this house, apartment, or mobile home on April 1, 2010, check the box on the form.
