Publication Schedule

- Starting with the 2012 White Book, BPA will only publish the document every other year (even years). This document will be similar to traditional White Books and will describe the planning context, major assumptions and conclusions from the analysis.
- BPA will publish a biennial summary update during the off years that contains only major changes from the last White Book publication.
- All information currently contained in the Technical Appendices will continue to be available electronically.

Changes to the Document

• Starting with the 2012 White Book (and every even year thereafter), BPA will include a Needs Assessment study that forecasts the timing and amount of resources BPA may need to acquire or plan for to reliably meet its obligations.
