
# Joint Operations Center Relocation Project

#### **Project Description**

- Shared facilities for:
  - Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation)
  - California Department of Water Resources (DWR)
  - National Weather Service (NWS)
- Relocate from existing interim Joint Operations Center (Existing JOC) at El Camino Road and Watt Avenue









#### **Project Description**

Accommodate about 600 employees

About 200,000 square feet

Approximately 16 acres of land

Preliminary design concepts









#### Why are we relocating?

- Existing JOC:
  - does not meet safety, physical security, and essential service requirements,
  - does not provide for future expansion, and
  - would require costly retrofit and remodel.
- The lease expires in June 2015



























Line of sight








#### **Environmental Issues in the EIS/EIR**
