"It's just a walk in the park," but it can be so much more! Join a Park Ranger for a leisurely hike on the Smittle Creek Trail, along the Western shoreline of

Lake Berryessa. Enjoy a summer day, get some fresh-air and exercise while learning about the natural and human history of the area on an easy to moderate 2.6 mile, one-way, guided hike. The trail travels through a shaded Blue Oak Woodland, affording hikers scenic views and peaceful surroundings. All hikes begin at 9 a.m. at the South end of the Smittle Creek Day Use Area parking lot, off of Berryessa-Knoxville Road. Vehicles can be shuttled to the trail end point at Coyote Knolls within the Oak Shores Day Use Area. Bring at least two liters of water and snacks/lunch to enjoy during the hike.
