

Dear Mr. Offley:

This is in further response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated November 25, 1988, our case number FOIA 88-106.

As indicated in previous correspondence with you, because of the volume of material responsive to your request, we have divided it into segments and are providing you with the releasable portions as they are prepared. This is segment three. Sanitized copies of those reports which have been reviewed are provided herewith (Enclosures 1-4).

5 U.S.C.(b)(3) (Exemption 3) of the FOIA pertains to information specifically exempted by statute from disclosure "provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on the issue, or (B) established particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matter to be withheld." The Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, is an Exemption 3 statute. Sections 141-146 of this Act prohibit the disclosure of information about nuclear weapons that is classified as Restricted Data or Formerly Restricted Data. The information withheld from Enclosures 1, 3, and 4 is pursuant to Exemption 3 which concerns nuclear weapon design, types, numbers and locations that is classified as Restricted Data or Formerly Restricted Data. Disclosure of the exempt data could jeopardize the common defense and the security of the nation.

5 U.S.C.(b)(6) (Exemption 6) under the FOIA pertains to information specifically exempted by statute from disclosure which applies to information which, if released, would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals. The information withheld from Enclosure 2 is pursuant to Exemption 6. Dr. George W. Ullrich, Deputy Director, Defense Nuclear Agency, is the Initial Denial Authority.

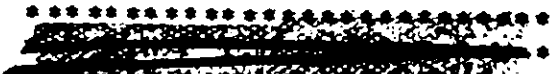

1. Per request of [Redacted] Post Chemical Officer, the following is a discussion of the procedures used during decontamination activities at the 16th Air Defense Missile Site (ROMARS) after the 7 June 1960 incident:

A. Summary of Incident: At approximately 1700 hours, 7 June 1960, a fire occurred in Shelter 2-4 at the ROMARS Site. The fire enveloped the warhead section of the missile causing the high explosive and nuclear components to burn. Residue from the plutonium device dropped to the shelter floor and was spread onto the ramp in front of the shelter and into the drainage ditch (see attached drawings) by liquid run-off from the fire suppressor operations.

B. Temporary Decon Measures:

(1) Residue which could be swept up was put through a "double burn" process for recovery of unburned plutonium. The ramp area was first used down with fire hoses and swept down with heavy bristle street brooms. Survey No. 2 indicates the effect of the initial sweep-down. Although residue was no longer visibly present on the paved surface, it was apparent that the contaminant had been absorbed into the porous asphalt. The same was true of the contamination in the ditch. This was proven when additional scrubbing of a portion of the paved area failed to reduce the alpha intensity.

(2) As a means of temporary fixation, the ramp area and forward half of the shelter were painted, partially by spraying and partially by brushing. Subsequent surveys revealed that the spraying process was less effective, that is, higher readings were taken on the areas that had been sprayed than on the other. It is believed that the air blast of the spray apparatus dislodged some of the particles which later settled back and were affixed to the surface of the paint. Although a higher intensity was indicated, these areas were no less safe than the others because the contaminant could not be re-suspended after the paint had dried. NOTE: The chief danger with an alpha problem of this nature is that personnel will breathe suspended contaminant particles. Breathing apparatus or respirators were worn by all personnel throughout the decon stages.

(3) Due to the frequency of rain showers during the first week after the incident, no decon measures were taken in the drainage ditch. The soil never dried out enough to cause re-suspension of the contaminant. Temporary fixation of the ditch was then accomplished by spraying the soil with used engine oil. This produced a "holding" effect and was not

susceptable to rapid evaporation. Much of the contaminant had been "weathered" into the soil by this time.

c. Permanent Decon Measures:

(1) Paved area between the rows of shelters was completely resurfaced with concrete (3 1/2" thick) as far up-slope as shelter 2-6. It should be understood that such measures are excessive when the contamination problem alone is considered. However, concrete of any lesser thickness would crack under the weight of heavy equipment which must be continually operated over this area. Seal coating the asphalt with tar and sand, as opposed to laying concrete, was considered; but the idea was not accepted since such a coating might wear off after a relatively short time.

(2) Permanent fixation in the ditch was accomplished by re-shaping the surface contour, thus causing the contaminant to be buried or turned under. Re-surfacing the ditch with a gurnite mixture was contemplated, but was decided against when radiological surveys indicated no significant intensities. After allowing the soil to dry thoroughly, used engine oil was again spread over the ditch.

2. Periodic surveys of the area indicate that the procedures used were almost totally effective. The most detailed of these monitoring activities indicate a widespread dispersal of minute amounts of plutonium oxide to a distance of about 100 yards from the original contaminated area. These particles, which were obviously carried out by the wind during the decon operations, cause a reading of about 2 to 3 times the normal background count. This figure is infinitesimal when compared to the allowable tolerance figure, and constitutes no hazard.

3. One interesting sidelight of the decon operation was an experiment carried out on an unpainted asphalt surface which originally showed high readings. Different paints (oil base, rubber base, asphalt base, and red lead base) were tested to determine which was most effective for temporary fixation of plutonium contaminant. The red lead base paint was 92% effective with one coating, 99% effective with two. The other paints ranged from 55% to 80% effective after one coating, and from 65% to 80% after two coats. Rubber base was second best, asphalt base next, and oil base the least effective. Color of the paint had no significance.

4. Although the information presented herein is not sensitive from a classified standpoint, it should be made available exclusively to military personnel for official use only.

ABSTRACT

On October 15-17 a trip was made to Hardinsburg, Kentucky, to collect information regarding nuclear safety in connection with a mid-air accident involving a B-52 and KC-135 of the Strategic Air Command. Two weapons were carried by the B-52. There were no detonations and no radiological safety hazards from the weapons. All nuclear safety practices appeared to have been followed, and all safety devices apparently behaved as predicted. The major warhead sections of the weapons survived the crash remarkably well. Public relations during this incident were handled in a notably straightforward manner and involved no security compromise. This materially helped in putting into proper perspective the acceptability of risks associated with nuclear weapons during airborne alert operations.

MID-AIR COLLISION NEAR HARDINSBURG, KENTUCKY

INTRODUCTION

On the evening of October 15, 1959, a KC-135 and a B-52 carrying two [redacted] weapons were involved in a mid-air accident near Hardinsburg, Kentucky, during a refueling operation. The aircraft were out of Columbus Air Force Base, Mississippi, and were participating in a SAC airborne alert operation. The KC-135 carried a crew of four men and all were killed. The B-52 carried a crew of eight including an instructor-pilot and an instructor-navigator. Four were killed and four escaped with minor injuries. The four who escaped were the instructor-pilot, the aircraft commander (pilot), the electronic-warfare officer and the radar operator.

INVESTIGATION PARTIES

A team was dispatched from Kirtland Air Force Base to advise on matters of nuclear safety. The team was headed by Col. Charles B. Stewart, Director of the Nuclear Safety Research Directorate (IG). Other participants were Lt. Col. Ernest Stewart of the Nuclear Safety Research Directorate, and Capt. Arthur F. Bishop of the Safety Analysis and Development Division, Development Directorate, AFSWC. Mr. Paul Schneider, ALO, and Mr. Robert F. Kail, Sandia Corporation, represented the AEC. Headquarters for the investigation was Godman Army Air Field which is adjacent to Fort Knox, Kentucky. Lt. General McConnell, Commanding Officer, Second Air Force, was in charge of the investigation. Major General Ryan, Director of Material, SAC, represented SAC Headquarters. Brig. General Samuels, Commanding Officer of Little Rock Air Force Base was also present and took charge of the investigation Friday afternoon when Generals McConnell and Ryan left. At least five Explosive Ordnance Disposal teams were dispatched to the area from various Air Force locations.

The team from Kirtland left Albuquerque at 11:00 pm on October 15 in a military C-47. We arrived at Godman approximately 8:00 am Central Daylight Time October 16. We reported directly to General McConnell upon arrival and left almost immediately thereafter by Army helicopter for the scene of the accident. We remained at the scene of the B-52 crash until approximately 11:30 am and then returned by helicopter to Godman. We participated in several discussions at Godman, including a telephone conversation with Mr. White of ALO, until approximately 2:30 pm. Col. Stewart, Lt. Col. Stewart and Capt. Bishop then returned by Military C-47 to Kirtland. Mr. Schneider and myself remained at Godman for discussions with Capt.

Simpson and further telephone conversations with Mr. White regarding the recovery problems. We left at approximately 3:30 pm by Army helicopter for Louisville, Kentucky, and spent Friday night, October 16, there. Mr. Schneider remained in Louisville until Monday at the request of Mr. White, and I returned to Albuquerque by commercial airlines on October 17, arriving in Albuquerque at approximately 11:40 am.

AIRCRAFT WRECKAGE

A mid-air explosion definitely occurred and possibly a mid-air collision. The KC-135 broke into two pieces and crashed; the two pieces separated by a distance of approximately one mile. The B-52 crashed in essentially one piece at a distance of some three miles from the KC-135 crash sites. The B-52 crashed in the edge of a wooded area on the side of a small hill and then burned. From the manner in which the trees were broken down and the aircraft remains lay on the ground, I would assume that the B-52 crashed in essentially a normal flight attitude; however, dropping almost flat along a path about 15° from the vertical. The tail section was broken off the aircraft just aft of the rear wheels and remained in relatively large pieces. There was one section of aft fuselage approximately 8 to 10 feet long which showed the full circumference of the fuselage. It was impossible to find a piece of structure forward of the rear wheel well larger than approximately a four foot square except for the engines. All 8 engines lay in roughly normal positions relatively intact except for fire damage. Two of the engines rested in a vertical attitude.

Burning was extremely severe and trees were burned back for a distance of at least 100 yards completely surrounding the clearing caused by the crash. The wreckage burned all evening and was still smoldering the next morning when we arrived. There was nothing but ashes left of the forward fuselage, cockpit and wings. Three of the bodies were in the forward cockpit. The tail gunner was apparently thrown clear of the crash. His body was found some distance away on the hillside.

Little or no burning occurred around the weapons in spite of the fact that there is a fuselage fuel tank in the B-52 directly over the bomb bay. It is my estimate that most of this fuel was thrown forward when the fuselage ruptured. Burning was spotty aft of the forward wheel well and appeared to be a function of where fuel was thrown. Little or no burning occurred in the remains of the tail section. Figure 1 is a sketch of the general area of wreckage of the B-52.

WEAPON WRECKAGE

The B-52 carried two [REDACTED] weapons. These weapons are flown on airborne alert under a set of safety rules which prescribe the following:

1. The U-2 rack lock will be safety wired and sealed in the locked position.
2. No release signals will be delivered to the U-2 rack.
3. The T-249 will be safety wired and sealed in the safe position.
4. The weapon safing pins will remain installed in the Bisch generator.

The weapons survived the accident in remarkably good condition. The HE did not detonate or burn although it was badly shattered. The forward case sections of both weapons were relatively intact and unmarred by fire. They were buried approximately two-thirds of their diameter in the dirt in the same relative positions which they occupied in the bomb bay and lay in a slightly nose down attitude. The afterbodies of both weapons had been torn off. It is my estimate that the aircraft absorbed much of the landing shock when it crumpled through the trees. Sometime during this initial shock, I believe the weapons broke loose from the aircraft and fell free to the ground. The mitigation of shock by the aircraft structure together with the shock-mitigating property of the moist, spongy clay soil probably were the main factors in preventing a one-point detonation of the weapons. The afterbody was torn from the rear weapon together with the alignment plate and lay approximately 4 to 6 feet to the right rear of the weapon. It was burned in spots, the afterbody structure was hardly recognizable, and some components including the high voltage safing switch were badly burned. Other components survived remarkably well. The low voltage arm/safe switch from this unit was recovered and was found to be in the safe position with the green S showing through the window. The Bisch generator on this unit was relatively intact. The safing pin was missing; however, the arming rods were in place and the cables on the arming rods were broken. An examination of the arming rods, the cables, etc., indicates that the safing pin must have been in place when the weapon broke away from the aircraft causing the arming rod cables to break as designed. The lanyard probably fouled and extracted the safing pin after it had performed its function and as the weapon fell free. The gas bottle on the rear unit was still in place with the tubing intact and no evident signs of damage. The cover plate over the top of the gas bottle was scorched and one of the mounting straps was loose. However, there was no apparent damage to the bottle itself, and I am convinced that it is intact and unfired.

The gas bottle on the forward unit had been torn completely free including the tubing that runs forward to the pit. This bottle was not found while I was at the scene; however, later reports indicate that it has been found relatively intact and unfired. There was no burning on either warhead case section. The stenciling was clear and no apparent damage other than some dents in the structure. There were no ruptures apparent from the surface. The afterbody of the forward unit had been torn free and thrown to the right and slightly forward, approximately three feet from the side of the forward warhead case. It had completely burned in this location. We dug for quite some time in an attempt to find the Bisch generator, but the most we could find were a few of the internal parts. Their condition indicated that the unit had burned completely. We did find some baro plumbing including a baro port fitting and one complete pullout valve. The valve, however, had been broken completely out of its mountings. The alignment plate on this weapon was still attached to the forward case; however, the bottom half of it had been rolled up by the weapon plunging into the dirt. Again we found the low voltage arm/safe switch, and although the connector had been broken loose, the switch did indicate that it was in a safe position with the letter S showing through the window. This switch was full of JP-4 fuel. The low voltage thermal battery from this unit had been torn free of the afterbody and thrown up the hillside some 15 feet forward and to the right of the weapon. It was scorched but otherwise unharmed. Both weapons had been monitored for tritium Thursday night and were again monitored Friday morning after we arrived. In neither case was there the slightest evidence of tritium leakage. The U-2 release mechanism for one of the weapons was found approximately 15 to 20 feet forward and to the right of the forward weapon. The hook which holds the chain was intact but the structure above the hook had broken, allowing the chain to come off. The evidence all pointed to the lock pin having been in place when the release mechanism was torn loose from the airplane. The other U-2 mechanism was not found. We did not find the T-249's although we did look for them; however, the forward cockpit area was completely reduced to ashes and after finding the bodies we decided not to disturb the area further. We then found both arm/safe switches and determined that they were in the safe position, so the need for finding the T-249's disappeared. Figure 2 is a sketch of the weapon wreckage.

SECURITY

The security control on this accident was favorably unique. Initial security was provided by Army MP's from Godman. They were relieved by Air Police from Seward Air Force Base at approximately 11:00 am Friday morning. MP's were stationed around the wreckage, and the

weapons were covered with blankets; however, the Air Force allowed the press and local civilians to essentially prowl the wreckage at will. The only restrictions were not to go near the blankets or to pick up anything. The press and the civilians were taken through in tours and were allowed to look to their hearts content. As a result there were no charges against the authorities for hiding anything and the newspaper accounts were very complete and accurate, yet security was not compromised. In fact, a front page photograph on the Louisville Courier-Journal of October 17 shows a photograph of Col. Stewart and myself examining the wreckage, an MP in the foreground, and a black arrow pointing at the blanket. The caption states firmly that beneath the blanket lies the nuclear weapon. The accident did receive photographic coverage on nationwide television news broadcasts. It should be noted that the coverage in the local Albuquerque newspapers was extremely inaccurate.

RECOVERY

As noted above, several telephone conversations were held with Mr. White of ALO regarding the possibility of tritium leakage into the pit and the need for Mr. Carter of LASL to travel to the scene of the accident. Based upon my own observations and discussions with Capt. Simpson, USAF, who commanded the Bossier Base EOD team and who had participated with Mr. Carter in the incident earlier this year at Barksdale, we advised Mr. White that we felt there was no need for Mr. Carter to travel to the accident since it was obvious that there was no tritium in the pits. As a result, Mr. Carter decided not to come although Mr. Schneider was instructed to remain to represent the AEC in the recovery operation. Recovery was turned over to a team [REDACTED]. The HE was spooned out by a team from Wright Patterson AFB and destroyed [REDACTED]. The weapons were mounted on a towboy trailer, returned [REDACTED] and delivered to the AEC for disposal. After my return to Albuquerque, I contacted Mr. Arthur B. Cole, the Sandia Corporation representative [REDACTED] and requested that he make an effort to have the low voltage safing switches and both the high and low voltage batteries returned to our QA organization here in Albuquerque for post-mortem. It should be interesting to determine the exact status of the squibs in the thermal batteries in view of the varying exposure to fire of the four units involved. In addition, I am extremely interested in determining the amount of mechanical damage and electrical shorting which occurred in the arm/safe switches. These switches suffered rather severe shocks and I would not be too surprised to find severe internal damage. This information could be valuable in designing new switches to attempt to protect against such damage, since the low voltage switch is so important in the basic safing picture.

SUMMARY

In summary, it is noted that the weapons survived remarkably well considering the shock that they must have experienced. It is believed that all safety rules were in effect at the time of the accident, and that none of the weapon safety features were negated by the accident. In addition, it is noted that there were no radiological hazards. The HE did not detonate, contrary to expectations. It did not even burn, but the powdering of the HE did cause a rather severe recovery problem.

I believe that the information gained from this accident has been very valuable for our file of accident histories, and I further believe that a personal visit by a Sandia representative was extremely worthwhile since we were able to make examinations of and determine exact conditions of weapon components. I would recommend that in all future accidents the Corporation attempt to send a representative who is thoroughly familiar with the weapon and its basic safety features and that we attempt to get all information possible regarding the damage to components which affect the safety picture.

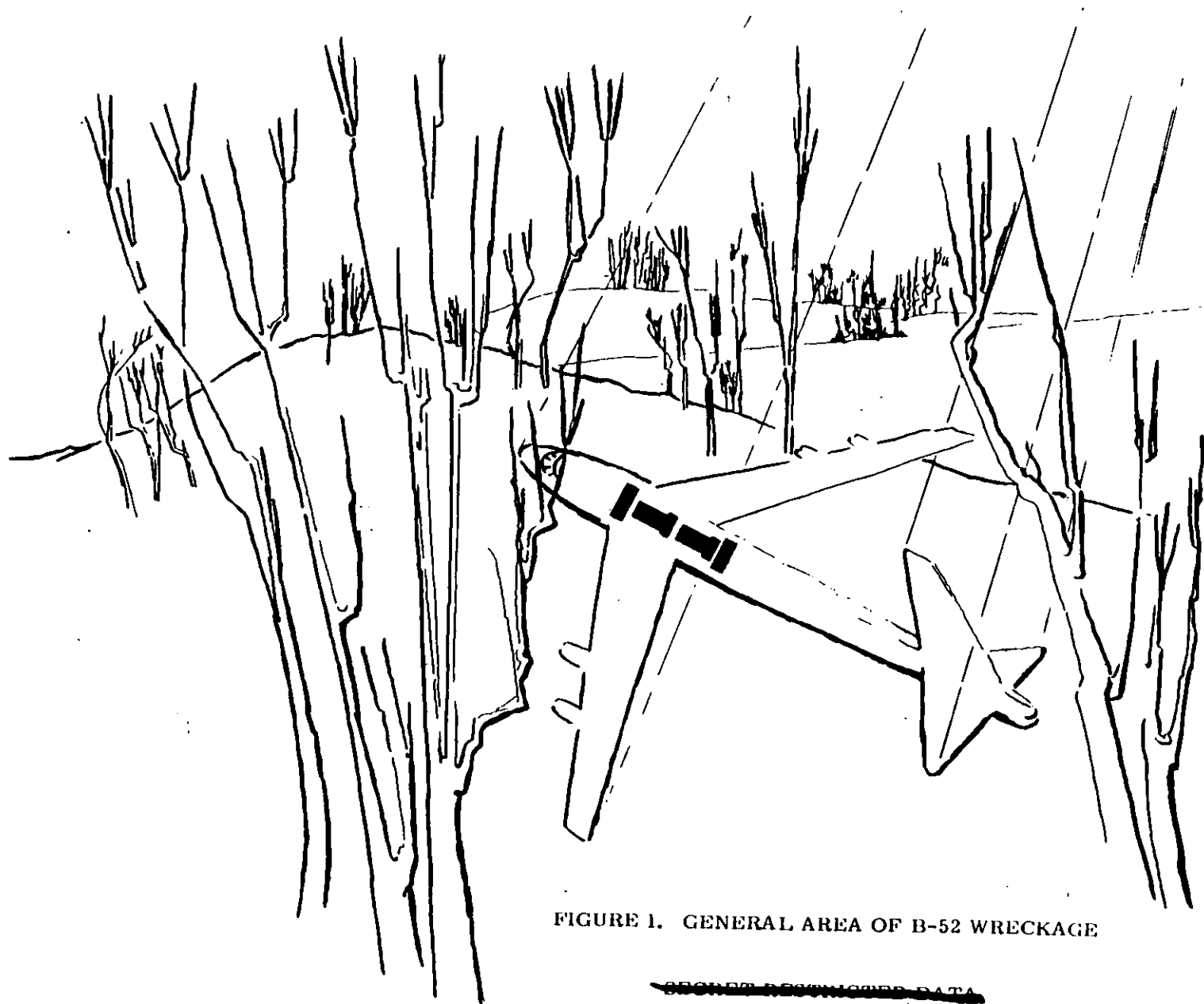
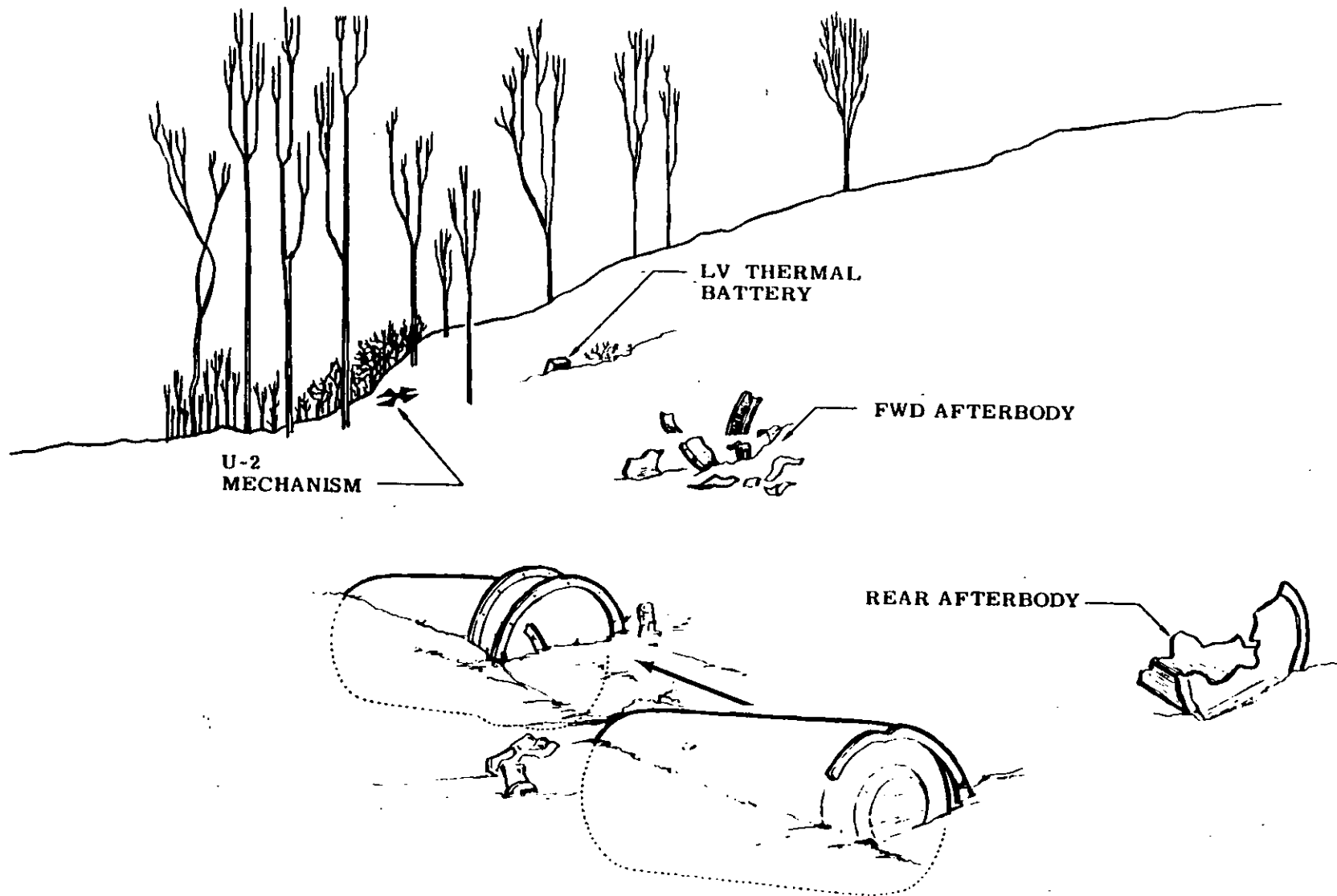


FIGURE 1. GENERAL AREA OF B-52 WRECKAGE

BACKGROUND:

1. ~~(S)~~ Excerpts from the 10 July 1985 issues of the New York Times (TABs 1 and 2) and Washington Post (TAB 3) provide an accurate overview of this subject and cite concerns expressed by officials of the State of New Jersey. The highlighted area of TAB 1 is the verbatim, UNCLASSIFIED accident description. TAB 4 indicates the Public Affairs involvement.
2. ~~(S)~~ Lt Col Phil Brown, Office of the Deputy for Environmental Safety, Department of the Air Force (Installations, Environmental, and Safety) is working closely with Lt Col Jones (DNA/Pentagon Liaison) to provide background information to ATSD(AE). Dr. Wagner has scheduled a 1600 hours meeting today with Representative Saxton, 13th District, New Jersey.

DISCUSSION:

1. ~~(S)~~ On June 7, 1960, a fire broke out in one of the cement missile buildings at McGuire Air Force Base in New Jersey. The missile system housed at McGuire at the time was the BOMARC, a liquid-fueled missile topped with a single ~~warhead~~ warhead. The fire apparently started in the missile fuel storage area, which is housed in the same cement walled building as the missile, about 20 feet from the missile itself. The roof directly above the fuel storage area was completely burned.

a. ~~(S)~~ The warhead support sagged during the fire, allowing the warhead to slide down to the floor. The HE around the primary burned completely. F. J. Dunn from Los Alamos wrote

The pit had been converted to a low mound of material, presumably a mixture of oxides. There were several pieces of slag, which looked like aluminum, and one piece of a darker metal, which might have been uranium or plutonium.

b. ~~(S)~~ Dunn's conclusion, shared by all involved at the scene, was that the HE ignited after the missile fuel fire was out. No significant alpha contamination was observed outside the general area of "low mound" on the floor, in spite of the observed raging flames from the fuel fire that shot 75 feet high above the collapsed roof over the fuel storage area.

c. ~~(S)~~ Experts on the scene recommended that the plutonium and or alloy in the Nuclear Weapon Accident Residue (NWAR) be reclaimed. The material was concentrated, had no residual HE problem, and seemed readily reclaimable. The nuclear material was not reclaimed and eventually the NWAR was sent to Pantex for storage.

2. ~~(S)~~ OPEA's research of this issue revealed that the Occupational and Environmental Health Laboratory (OEHL) Brooks AFB, Texas, is responsible for annual monitoring of the accident site. Heretofore, the results of OEHL's monitoring efforts have not evidenced any radioactive leakage. The last time the site was surveyed was September 1984.

3. ~~(S)~~ Telephonic discussion with Department of Energy officials evidenced that an Aerial Measurement System survey was conducted on 12, 13 and 14 November 1983.

Kean Says Ex-Missile Base Is Still Tainted by Radiation

TRENTON, July 9 — Governor Kean said today that his administration had learned from the Department of Defense that radioactive material from a nuclear weapon that burned at McGuire Air Force Base in 1960 was still contaminating a "sizeable" part of the former missile site.

Mr. Kean said he had been assured that a wide area of the accident site had been sealed in reinforced concrete and that it was being monitored continuously for possible radioactive emissions.

But he said that his aides had learned of the seriousness of the problem almost by accident, and that he was "greatly concerned" that state officials had not been informed of the extent of the contamination or its potential dangers over the last 25 years.

"While we are not yet certain of all the details," the Governor said, "it is clear that an undetermined number of acres were contaminated by plutonium which was dispersed during the incident."

"But we know very little, if anything, about it," he said. "That is not acceptable and it won't be acceptable in the future."

Defense Department Report

In Washington, an Air Force spokesman said he had no reason to believe that any radioactive material had escaped the immediate area of the fire.

He cited a brief description of the accident contained in a 1981 report by the Department of Defense that said, "The contamination was restricted to an area immediately beneath the weapon and an adjacent elongated area approximately 100 feet long, caused by the draining off of firefighting water."

But James R. Marshall, the chief of

staff of the Federal Environmental Protection Agency for the New York region, said that a wide area — about 400,000 square feet, or nearly 10 acres — had been sealed in concrete to contain the contamination.

News accounts of the accident, which occurred on June 7, 1960, reported that a Bomarc missile burned on its pad at the 218-acre 46th Air Defense Missile Squadron base in Jackson Township, sending an orange-yellow cloud into the air and spreading a small amount of radioactive material around the 40 by 50 foot silo.

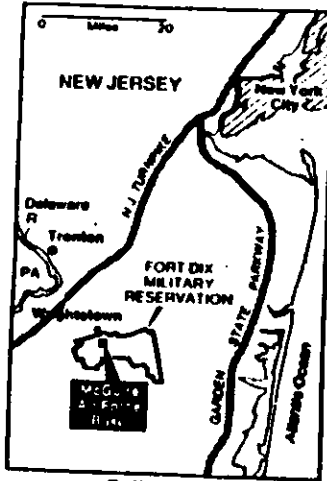
Meeting in Washington

The Governor said today that state environmental officials first learned of the seriousness of the accident at a meeting in Washington on July 2. The meeting had been called by Federal officials to discuss using the former missile site to store low level radioactive material being cleaned up from residential areas in Essex County.

The director of the State Division of Environmental Quality, Donald A. Deieso, learned about the contamination at the meeting with Federal environmental officials and Carl Schafer, director of environmental policy for the Department of Defense.

"The real dimension of the release of nuclear material and the extent of the contamination have never been fully revealed," Mr. Deieso said. "I also heard about plutonium for the first time on July 2 and, although we are still awaiting further information, the contamination may also include uranium."

"What I heard at the meeting," he continued, "implied far more than a mild fire, and the incident may well have involved the burning of the entire warhead."

If the contamination involves plutonium or uranium, the problem will remain on the site for hundreds of years, he said.

Robert E. Hughey, the New Jersey Environmental Protection Commissioner, said the state wants to sink its own monitoring wells around the missile site and to participate fully in designing and carrying out a cleanup program.

Governor Kean today sent a letter to Lee Thomas, the Federal Environmental Protection Administrator, and to Defense Secretary Casper W. Weinberger, requesting all scientific information about the accident and its aftermath.

In the letter, Mr. Kean also asked for information on any other potential nuclear-contamination problems or risks at Federal installations in the state.

Mr. Hughey said he examined his department's records and found that the state, responding to residents who said they had heard rumors about problems from nuclear material on the site, had

checked the perimeter of the base in the 1970's for possible radioactivity. He said the tests found no radioactivity.

Declassified in 1973

He said, however, that the state was never told of the concrete sealing of the contaminated area and had never seen any data on the monitoring by the Air Force.

Mr. Deieso said he was told the monitoring included tests of underground water, but he said the state had never seen any results of the tests.

Mr. Marshall of the Environmental Protection Agency said the former Bomarc site had been surveyed by a number of Federal agencies since 1973, when the information about the accident was first declassified.

He said that his agency would send copies of those reports to New Jersey officials and ask the Defense Department whether any further information is available.

According to the surveys, he said, the area sealed in concrete is 400,000 square feet.

"All the surveys that have been conducted indicate the problem is pretty well contained and there doesn't appear to be any immediate cause for alarm," Mr. Marshall said.

Poisoning Symptoms

Plutonium, a man-made element, is a metal produced when natural uranium is bombarded with neutrons in a nuclear reactor. It emits alpha particles, which are not strong enough to penetrate the skin but can cause cancer in lung tissue or bone marrow if inhaled or ingested.

In addition, experts in nuclear materials say, plutonium, as a heavy metal, can cause poisoning symptoms similar to those caused by lead or mercury. They are divided over whether the chemical toxicity is a more serious hazard than the radiation.

In a warhead, plutonium is in solid form and is not likely to be absorbed internally. But warheads also contain conventional high explosives, which are used to detonate the nuclear bomb, and these can burn or explode accidentally. Plutonium itself can ignite spon-

taneously, on contact

in air. According to Joseph and radiation specialist catches fire, it produces plutonium.

A Pentagon Study Describes '60 Fire at McGuire Air Base

WASHINGTON, July 9 — A study published by the Pentagon in 1981 listed the nuclear-weapon accident at McGuire Air Force Base in New Jersey among 32 such incidents dating back to 1950.

The report, "Narrative Summaries of Accidents Involving U.S. Nuclear Weapons 1950-1980," described the accident as follows:

"A Bomarc air-defense missile in ready-storage condition (permitting launch in two minutes) was destroyed by explosion and fire after a high-pressure helium tank exploded and ruptured the missile's fuel tanks. The warhead was also destroyed by the fire although the high explosive did not detonate. Nuclear safety devices acted as designed. Contamination was restricted to an area immediately beneath the weapon and an adjacent elongated area approximately 100 feet long, caused by draining off of firefighting water."

Lieut. Col. Mark Fouch of the Air Force, who wrote the 1981 study, said today that the contaminated area had been paved over to prevent soil from moving. Although the entire Bomarc base, including launch pads, support buildings and barracks, covered about 75 acres, only the near vicinity of the accident was affected by nuclear materials, he said.

"I've never had any indication that the remaining nuclear material was out of control," he said.

"There is no hazard at all, no potential for harm today," said William Caldwell, a spokesman for the Defense Department.

Representative James J. Florio, a New Jersey Democrat who also is chairman of a House subcommittee with jurisdiction over toxic waste sites, said in an interview today that the Defense Department "has just been very cavalier in this nuclear contamination area."

"They may be monitoring this site, but using what standards?" he asked.

"Who says a cement covering radioactive site is an adequate solution?"

He said he felt that this kind of claim should be reported to the Environmental Protection Agency.

"But this Administration's position is that that's not the case," he said. "The interpretation of this Administration is that the E.P.A. has no jurisdiction and it is a Defense Department matter."

'A Loose Cannon'

Mr. Florio called the Defense Department "sort of a loose cannon" it comes to disposing of any kind of toxic material.

"This site is on the aquifer that serves the drinking water needs of the people in south Jersey, and it's never told us about it."

Mr. Florio said it was "my information" that Governor Kean's Air Force Base site from E.P.A. officials during a recent discussion of possible dumpsites for radon-contaminated sites removed from residential sites in Essex County, N.J.

Calling this report "incredible, true," Mr. Florio said he had heard that the New Jersey officials "were looking for a place to dump radioactive waste, and these Federal guys said 'Wait a minute, we've got a place at McGuire Air Force Base that's already contaminated with radioactivity, let's put it there.'"

The Bomarc weapons, early ancestors of modern cruise missiles, were designed to protect cities from Soviet bomber attacks. Some 47 feet long with a wing span of 18 feet, they were launched from concrete bunkers and climbed close enough to their targets to destroy them with a nuclear warhead. They quickly became obsolete, however, because of technical advances and the danger of exploding nuclear devices near populated areas.

This request is for copies of all DNA regulations promulgated by the DNA and other government agencies concerning the reporting of or disclosure of nuclear weapons mishaps, accidental discharge or firing of nuclear weapons; copies of any reports concerning actual nuclear weapons mishaps, inventory losses or irregularities in the nuclear weapons stockpile; and any synthesis reports or abstracts compiling nuclear weapons incidents, mishaps or losses throughout the history of your organization and any legally constituted predecessor agency.

In particular, I write to request report copies identified as:

- * "Nuclear Weapons Response Procedures Manual;" current edition
- * Reports of Nuclear Weapons Exercises (NUWAX) for 1979, 1981, 1983 and thereafter;
- * "Nuclear Accident Response Capability Listing," published by the DNA in 1979 or latest subsequent report by that title.
- * DOD Nuclear Weapons Technical System TF-25-1, 1 Jan. 74 or latest edition.

As you know, the amended Act provides that if some parts of a file are exempt from release that "reasonably segregable" portions shall be provided. I therefore request that, if you determine that some portions of the requested information are exempt, you provide me immediately with a copy of the remainder of the file. I reserve my right to appeal any such decisions to withhold information.

If you determine that some or all of the requested information is exempt from release under the Act, I further request you provide me immediately with a

detailed catalogue of the material withheld, and the specific exemption being cited for such withholding.

I am prepared to pay costs specified in your regulations for locating the requested files and reproducing them. However, since the purpose of this request under the Act is to compile information for an article(s) to be published in The Seattle Post-Intelligencer, a daily newspaper serving the Pacific Northwest, and since the Act provides for a waiver of such fees if releasing the material is deemed in the public interest, I request such a waiver of fees. Should you determine otherwise, I would appreciate your contacting me in advance of retrieval of the information requested to obtain a cost estimate of such retrieval and reproduction.

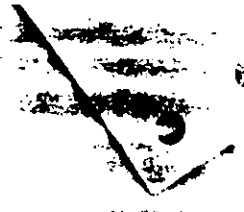

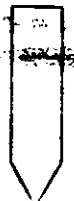
