

1. Reference is made to your memorandum* for the Chairman,	1
Joint Chiefs of Staff, dated 29 September 1958, subject as	2
above, wherein you outlined the Presidential approval** for	3
SAC airborne alert exercises. This memorandum also contained	4
a request for periodic submissions to the President's briefing	5

2. Operation HEAD START is an airborne alert exercise utilizing B-52 aircraft. Operating from (b)(1)

Each aircraft flys approximately this same triangular course 14 twice during each mission, is refueled once by a KC-135 tanker, 15 for a total mission time of approximately 19 hours. 16

- 3. Pursuant to the Presidential approval, operation HEAD 17 START was commenced with sealed-pit weapons on 3 October 1958. 18 During the period 3 31 October 1958, results were as follows: 19
