# FY 2007 BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE DATA 2005 COMMISSION NATIONAL GEOSPATIAL-INTELLIGENCE AGENCY

## Overview

BRAC 2005 recommendation 168 directs the consolidation of the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency into a single location at Engineering Proving Grounds Fort Belvoir, VA.

## Schedule:

Moving Parts and Specific Actions:

- 1. Construct new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 2. Move National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) activities from Dalecarlia and Sumner sites, Bethesda, MD, to the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 3. Move activities from Reston 1, 2 and 3, leased installations in Reston, VA, to the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 4. Move activities from Newington buildings 8510, 8520 and 8530, Newington, VA, to the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 5. Move activities from Building 213, South East Federal Center, Washington, DC, to the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 6.  $\underline{\text{Move}}$  functions of the National Reconnaissance Office facility, Westfields, VA, to the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 7. Move all NGA National Geospatial-Intelligence College functions on Fort Belvoir into the new facility at Fort Belvoir, VA.
- 8. <u>Close</u> National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) Dalecarlia and Sumner sites, Bethesda, MD.
- 9. <u>Terminate</u> permit with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Baltimore District, for Dalecarlia site.
- 10.<u>Close</u> Reston 1, 2 and 3, leased installations in Reston, VA.
- 11. <u>Terminate</u> lease for Reston 1, 2, and 3, leased installations in Reston, VA.
- 12. Close Newington buildings 8510, 8520, and 8530, Newington, VA.
- 13. <u>Terminate</u> lease for Newington buildings 8510, 8520, and 8530, Newington, VA.
- 14. <u>Close</u> Building 213 at the South East Federal Center, Washington, DC.
- 15. <u>Terminate</u> lease for Building 213 at the South East Federal Center, Washington, DC.

## Schedule Issues:

There are a number of challenges to executing the NGA BRAC recommendation as indicated above. Some of the significant issues that are external to NGA include:

- 1. Environmental Impact Statement (EIS): Army is responsible for completion of the EIS for all of Ft. Belvoir. Site development construction cannot start until the Army signs the Record of Decision (ROD). The Army has said that it will take 12-months for the EIS process, which is now scheduled for a summer 2007 completion.
- 2. Ft. Belvoir Master Plan: Army is responsible for preparation of an overall Master Plan for all of Ft. Belvoir. Design of NGA facilities cannot proceed until a specific site is identified for NGA facilities. The Army will begin to develop their Master Plan after FY 2006 BRAC funds are released. Initial siting decisions will be made 60-90 days after their contract is awarded. The Master Plan will be completed concurrently with the EIS and ROD.

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- 3. Clean Up of Ft. Belvoir Building Sites: Many prospective sites at Ft. Belvoir are contaminated by Unexploded Ordnance (UXO's) and other hazardous materials. Construction cannot begin until UXO's are removed. The Army must first characterize the site and then clear the UXO. Cleanup also affects construction of the Fairfax County Parkway extension, which is a key transportation improvement needed to support additional development at the post. Ft. Belvoir has not been able to affect the land transfer to the Virginia Department of Transportation due to not meeting state environmental requirements.
- 4. Transportation Improvements: Extension of the Fairfax County Parkway around the Ft, Belvoir Engineer Proving Grounds is critical to provide a second access point to the Engineer Proving Grounds (EPG) site. The Army must transfer the land to the Commonwealth of Virginia before this funded road improvement can be started. The land transfer has been delayed by environmental clean-up of oil spills that encroach upon the proposed road right-of-way. The parkway must be completed in early 2010 to allow for connection to on-site transportation needed to serve NGA employees and other occupants of the EPG site.

#### Mission Impact:

Currently, the bulk of the funding for the NGA consolidation is in FY 2009 and FY 2010. This funding allocation will force the NGA compression of the construction and outfitting time available for NGA's sophisticated operational facilities. This will require the relocation of analytical personnel and supporting IT equipment over a shorter period of time. This schedule compression will increase the risk of mission failure of critical national intelligence programs and jeopardize NGA's ability to accomplish its missions over this period. During the FY 2008 programming cycle, NGA may realign funding to allow for a more effective schedule.

## Environmental Considerations:

Currently there are no known significant environmental concerns at the installations that are being closed or realigned.
