For FY 2004, 48 reserve Marines were called to active duty in support of ONE operational and Antiterrorism/Force Protection (AT/FP) requirements for Homeland Defense, providing Quick Reaction Force/Rapid Response Force (QRF/RRF) capabilities. Also, the Marine Corps plans to procure equipment, material, and services (fortification, barriers, and other physical security measures) to meet the AT/FP requirements at various Marine Corps bases, stations, and reserve centers; and the cost of command and control communication requirements necessary to meet its mission of defending the homeland and provide interoperability with civil agencies. Homeland defense requirements are continuously subject to review, as necessary to accommodate changes in threat, mission, duration, objectives, and field input. In FY 2006 these costs are now in the baseline, as directed by OSD, and not part of the FY 2006 Supplemental Request. Funded in baseline appropriations.
