For expenses of activities and agencies of the Department of Defense (other than the military departments) necessary for procurement, production, and modification of equipment, supplies, materials, and spare parts therefor, not otherwise provided for; the purchase of not to exceed 103 passenger motor vehicles, for replacement only; the purchase of 7 vehicles required for physical security of personnel, notwithstanding price limitations applicable to passenger vehicles but not to exceed \$250,000 per vehicle; expansion of public and private plants, equipment, and installation thereof in such plants, erection of structures, and acquisition of land for the foregoing purposes, and such lands and interests therein, may be acquired, and construction prosecuted thereon prior to approval of title; reserve plant and Government and contractor-owned equipment layaway; \$2,128,967,000 to remain available for obligation until September 30, 2002.

EXPLANATION OF FY 1998 AGENCY CHANGES

Office of the Secretary of Defense - (\$-1,886 thousand)

The net reduction is composed of increases to finance Drug Interdiction efforts (\$+3,500 thousand), and other net reductions of \$5,386 thousand.

Defense Special Weapons Agency - (\$-17,031 thousand)

The reduction reflects a transfer of \$17,031 thousand to the Defense Threat Reduction Agency.

Defense Information Systems Agency - (\$+4,737 thousand)

The increase is composed of increases to finance Drug Interdiction efforts (\$+4,000 thousands), various other reprogrammings of \$737 thousand.

Defense Threat Reduction Agency - (\$+18,400 thousand)

The increase is composed of \$+17,031 thousand transferred from Defense Nuclear Agency and \$+110 from the On-Site Inspection Agency and other net reprogrammings of \$1,259 thousand.

Defense Logistics Agency - (\$-558 thousand)

The decrease reflects various below threshold reprogrammings.

Defense Security Service - Formerly Defense Investigative Service - (\$-74 thousand)

The reduction reflects various below threshold reprogrammings.

Defense Contract Audit Agency - (\$-51 thousand)

The reduction reflects various below threshold reprogrammings.

Defense Support Project Office - (\$-265 thousand)

The reduction reflects various below threshold reprogrammings.

The Joint Staff - (\$-504 thousands)

The decrease reflects various below threshold reprogrammings.

On-Site Inspection Agency - (\$-110 thousand)

This reduction reflects a transfer of \$110 thousands to Defense Threat Reduction Agency.

Ballistic Missile Defense Organization - (\$-30,164 thousand)

The decrease reflects various below threshold reprogrammings (\$-5,264 thousand) and various reprogrammings of (\$-24,900 thousand).

<u>Defense Commissary Agency – (\$-27 thousand)</u>

This reduction reflects below threshold reprogrammings.

Classified Programs, Unclassified Summary - (\$+7,191 thousand)

The net increase is composed of an increase for Drug Interdiction efforts (\$+7,555 thousand), various reprogrammings (\$+818 thousand) and below threshold adjustments (\$-1182 thousand).

Special Operations Forces - (\$-3,457 thousand)

The reduction reflects an increase for Drug Interdiction efforts (\$+2,600 thousand), a reprogramming of funds for SOF Rotary Wing Upgrades (\$-8,300 thousand) and various below threshold reprogrammings (\$-2,243 thousands).

Chemical Biological Defense - (\$+4,183 thousand)

This increase reflects reprogrammings for individual protection (\$+9,037 thousand), various reprogrammings (\$-2,837 thousand) and various below threshold reprogrammings (\$-2,017 thousand).

EXPLANATION OF FY 1999 AGENCY CHANGES

Office of the Secretary of Defense - (\$-49,900 thousand)

The net decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-475 thousand), a congressional transfer (\$-77,425 thousand) plus an increase (\$+10,000 thousand) for the Mentor Protégé program, an increase (\$+10,000 thousand) for the High Performance Computing Hardware, an increase (\$+8,000 thousand) for the Indian Financing Act.

Defense Information Systems Agency - (\$-331 thousand)

The decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions.

Defense Logistics Agency - (\$+31,661 thousand)

The net increase is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-300 thousand), a congressional increase for the Automated Document Conversion Center (\$+20,000 thousand), a congressional increase for the Military Personnel Information Center (\$+12,000 thousand) and below threshold reprogrammings (\$-39 thousand).

Defense Security Service - (\$ -14 thousand)

The net decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions.

Defense Contract Audit Agency - (\$-11 thousand)

The decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions.

Defense Support Project Office - (\$-12,313 thousand)

The net decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-12 thousand), a congressionally directed transfer for the Defense Airborne Reconnaissance Program (\$-11,998 thousand) and below threshold reprogrammings (\$-303 thousand).

The Joint Staff - (\$-100 thousand)

The decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions.

Ballistic Missile Defense Organization - (\$-97,938 thousand)

The net decrease is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-938 thousand), a congressionally directed program transfer (\$-95,000 thousand) and the proposed realignment of inflation savings for programmatic requirements (\$-2,000 thousand).

<u>Defense Security Cooperation Agency – (\$+300 thousand)</u>

The congressional adjustment to continue operations.

Defense Threat Reduction Agency- (\$+913 thousand)

The net increase is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-87 thousand), and a below threshold reprogramming (\$+1,000 thousand).

Classified Programs, Unclassified Summary - (\$ +23,070 thousand)

The net increase is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-306 thousand), and a congressionally directed net program increase (\$+23,376 thousand).

Special Operations Forces - (\$-9,644 thousand)

The net decrease is composed of congressionally directed program decreases for the Advanced Seal Delivery system (\$-18,400 thousand) and increases (\$10,056 thousand) and a below threshold transfer (\$-1,300 thousand).

Chemical Biological Defense - (\$+19,753 thousand)

The net increase is composed of unspecified congressional reductions for revised economic assumptions (\$-847 thousand), an internal reprogramming for Portal Shield (\$+14,000 thousand), and emergency supplemental for the National Guard (\$+8,000 thousand) and below threshold reprogrammings (\$-1,400 thousand).
