Scenario Explanation

You are a member of a platoon on foot patrol in Ramadi, Iraq. Your element has come in contact with the enemy and there is a casualty down in an open area. Your platoon sergeant is directing you to move the casualty forward to a covered position to provide treatment while they attempt to suppress the enemy with fire. He has indicated that you should move him to the low wall directly in front of your position. You can see movement from the casualty, but he does not respond to your orders to crawl to cover. Evaluator will shadow you for feedback.
