You know this area at least as well as I do. In my own speeches and presentations during the past couple of weeks, I have found that the issue of better coordination strikes a very responsive chord. In particular (as we were discussing at the Head Start meeting yesterday), the idea of rethinking Head Start and Chapter 1 in tandem with each other is very persuasive.

I have used the metaphor of a multi-state rocket to capture this idea. Stage 1 is what we do for infants and toddlers; stage 2 is Head Start and other organized pre-K activities; stage 3 is Chapter 1. Only if these three rocket stages are linked and fire in sequence will vulnerable kids get off the launching pad and achieve escape velocity (i.e., escape from vulnerability, poverty, and diminished expectations).

A second theme that strikes a responsive chord is that of Bill Clinton taking to Washington what he learned and achieved as governor, in Arkansas and in the context of the NGA. A perfect example is the National Education Goals. Without going too deeply into details, you could certainly say that the President is working on legislation that will make the goals meaningful and effective for every school district in America, through

- o meaningful standards and assessment
- o reformed curricula that reflect the goals
- o fair opportunity to learn for every child
- o training that enables teachers to master the new curriculum materials and present it in an innovative and effective manner to students
