



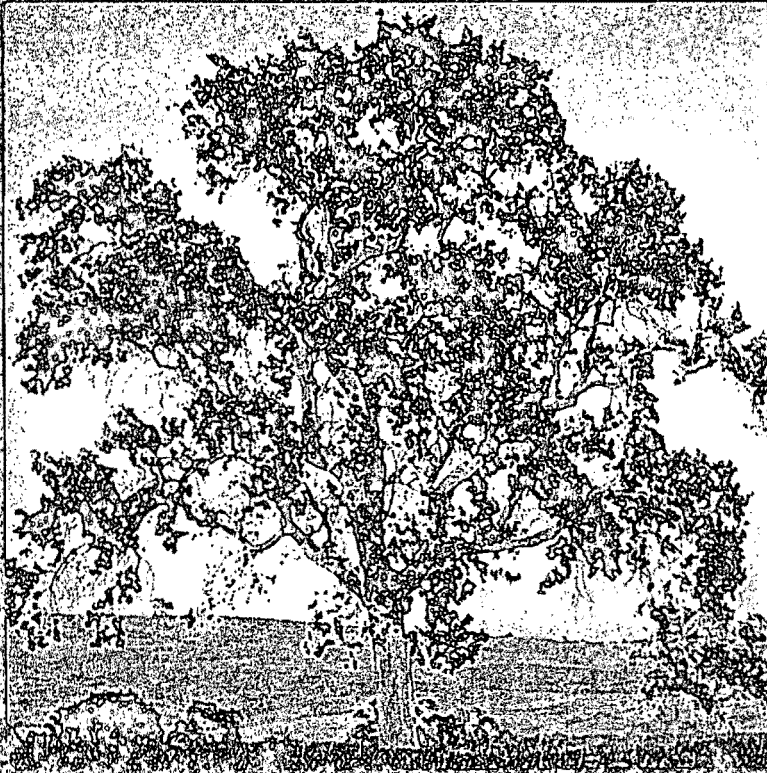

Fellowships in the California Agricultural Leadership Program are granted on the basis of the applicants' leadership potential and upon their willingness to learn, grow and make future contributions to agriculture and society as a whole.

During the two years of the fellowship program, the recipients are involved in seven in-state seminars per year, one national travel seminar and one international travel seminar for a total of 80+ days. Training and development focus primarily on the areas of leadership development, communications, economics, government, sociological issues and the arts.

Four public universities join with private industry and education in hosting seminars for the California Agricultural Leadership Program. The four cooperating universities are:

University of California at Davis; California State University at Fresno; California State Polytechnic University at Pomona; and California Polytechnic State University at San Luis Obispo.

Graduates of the California Agricultural Leadership Program have risen to leadership positions within their communities, their commodities, California's State Capitol and even the United States Congress. They are prepared to deal effectively with the complicated issues that influence agriculture and our entire society.
