SUBJECT: Talking points and background for the Arc luncheon 3-21-94

### NOTES AND TALKING POINTS

The Audience: 250 volunteers (approx 60%) and executive directors (40%) from 30 states. Volunteers are generally chapter or state Arc presidents or chairs of government affairs committees.

The time available: 20 to 25 minutes after the luncheon.

The context: This is their annual Governmental Affairs Seminar and the day after your talk all these folks are expected to make Hill visits. On Sunday nite, they will attend a plenary session by Arc Washington staff on the nuts and bolts of health care reform. On Monday morning, the first session on health care reform will include Mary Harahan (HHS), Janet O'Keefe (CCD), Bobbie Silverstein (Harkin staff) Laura Vogt (Family Voices). The second plenary on long term serice reform has our Ruth Katz, Any Imperatto (Harkin), Julia Fortier (House Health & Energy), Deborah Briceland-Betts (Coalition for Long-Term Care Reform), and Tony Young (CCD).

So by the time you come on they will have had a cumulative 4 and 1/2 hours of exposure to the details of health care reform.

AFTER THE LUNCHEON, they will move to the topic of IDEA reauthorization with a panel not yet fully confirmed (Tom Hehir, invited).

The message sought: According to Paul Marchand, a talk like the one you gave to the Arc of Maryland would be very well-received by this group (albeit perhaps compressed).

Health care is the issue on which they ask you to focus.

Praise for Arc's staunch support for the President's health care plan. (Marchand tells me that they are working very closely with Mike Lux on grass-roots organizing efforts).

The Arc Government Relations Staff (Marchand, Marty Ford, and Kathy McGinley) can be singled out for their work in this mobilization and in their equally hard work in the CCD Coalition whose testimony was strongly supportive of our plan. The recognition that while no health care plan is perfect or nirvanah, the Arc has come to recognize that our plan is the one they support because it meets their basic needs.

But that even with all the tireless efforts of the Marchands, Fords, and McGinleys health care reform will not become law without each one of the members of this audience persuading their member to get behind the President.

Reiteration of the President's bottom line on universal coverge. Reassurances on long-term care reform being an integral part of his health care package.

The issue of coverage for congenital disabilities being given the closest of reconsideration (or whatever you think we can say on the illness or injury limitation -- perhaps ask Jennifer Klein where they are on this and the lower than expected costs).

Summary: This audience needs both praise and motivation to get their membership to go further in support of health care reform lobbying. They will respond to your parent-to-parent approach. I've been invited to attend the luncheon as well, and will be available to provide you with any additional or more specific points along the above lines. Please let me know if you would like more.
