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### Pre-Briefing: Homeless Issues

# 1. DPC Responsibility

- perception of outside world is that we are now responsible. This is now a DPC working group with WH imprimatur and interagency participation
- Key: interagency, not just HUD

### 2. What does the Council do?

- specific concern: things that used to be done by the Council are not being done because of lack of budget, clear mandate to continue
  - specific tasks:
    - mailing list
    - data base
    - technical assistance: through people in field
    - publications (not HUD, but interagency)
      monthly newsletter
      bimonthly program announcements
- need to let the world know what will continue to be done and by whom, and what won't
- if problem for HUD, then other agencies could be asked to pick up certain pieces
- 3. What about the Council itself?
  - Should we have a meeting of the principals
- purpose: send clear signal about (1) continuing priority signal to staff; (2) plan implementation; (3) affirm everyone's roles in an interagency effort

#### 4. Plan Implementation

- need a work plan from Council staff on how the various commitments will be met
- process in place (again interagency) for taking on the follow-through on each recommendation

#### 5. Longer Term

- need to think about having Executive Director report to Domestic Policy Advisor

I know that our offices are trying to set up a meeting between us to discuss next steps for the Interagency Council and implementation of the homeless plan.

I wanted to suggest a couple of topics for the agenda that might require a little shought and preparation. First, I would like to discuss our vision for the ongoing role of the Interagency Council itself and to agree on the purpose and subjects for future meetings of the Council's members. I would be interested in your thoughts bout timing and agendas for such meetings this year.

Second, I am concurred about the continuity of some of the ongoing functions of the Council that are no longer funded, but are being kept up by HUD. Specifically, Congressman Vento recently wrote concerning the database with consolidated grant information that the Council used to maintain. I understand that HUD is intending to keep that up, but that the transition has not occurred yet. I would greatly appreciate it if you could bring to the meeting a status report on each of the functions of the Council and an indication of which ones HUD intends to continue and how so that I know what we are and are not going to do. It strikes me that the Council's role in disseminating information and providing technical assistance in the field was very important, and I would like to know how much of that will continue.

Please let me know if there are other specific issues you would like to discuss. Thank you very much.
