

NMFS ATLANTIC TUNAS PROGRAM FOR JANUARY 1, 2011 – DECEMBER 31, 2011 SUMMARY OF FISHERY INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS FOR ATLANTIC TUNA FISHERIES

MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

Atlantic tunas are managed under the dual authority of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act) and the Atlantic Tunas Convention Act (ATCA). ATCA authorizes the Secretary of Commerce to implement the binding recommendations of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT). The authority to manage the U.S. Atlantic tuna fisheries is delegated to the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), Highly Migratory Species (HMS) Management Division.

REGULATED SPECIES

Tunas subject to regulation are Atlantic bluefin tuna (BFT) (*Thunnus thynnus*), as well as "BAYS" tunas, i.e., bigeye tuna (BET) (*Thunnus obesus*), albacore tuna (ALB) (*Thunnus alalunga*), yellowfin tuna (YFT) (*Thunnus albacares*), and skipjack tuna (SKJ) (*Katsuwonus pelamis*).

MANAGEMENT AREA

These regulations apply in all waters of the Atlantic Ocean, including the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean Sea.

OVERVIEW OF BFT DOMESTIC QUOTAS

The adjusted quota for the 2011 fishing year (January 1-December 31) is 957.4 metric tons (mt)*. The Reserve, to be used for inseason adjustments, fishery research, and other domestic management objectives, is set at 70.5 mt.

PERMIT PROGRAM

All owners/operators of vessels (commercial, charter/headboat, or recreational) fishing for regulated Atlantic tunas in the management area must obtain an Atlantic tunas or Atlantic HMS vessel permit. Atlantic tunas permits are issued in five commercial categories: General, Harpoon, Purse Seine, Longline, and Trap. Atlantic HMS permits are issued in two categories: Recreational Angling and Charter/Headboat. Only one permit category may be assigned to a vessel.

Permit holders may not change permit category after 10 days from the date of permit issuance.

This brochure is produced in compliance with section 212 of the Small Business Regulatory Enforcement Fairness Act.

While persons aboard a vessel with an HMS Charter/Headboat permit are fishing for or are in possession of Atlantic HMS, the vessel operator must have a valid Merchant Marine License or Uninspected Passenger Vessel License, issued by the U.S. Coast Guard.

All fish dealers purchasing regulated Atlantic tunas from vessels holding an Atlantic tunas permit or an Atlantic HMS vessel permit must obtain an Atlantic tunas dealer permit. An International Trade Permit is required for the international trade of fresh or frozen Atlantic or Pacific bluefin tuna, southern bluefin tuna, swordfish, and/or frozen bigeye tuna.

Atlantic tunas may be sold only by fishermen permitted in commercial categories and only to permitted dealers. Atlantic tunas taken aboard Angling category vessels may <u>not</u> be sold.

NMFS maintains an automated permitting system for the issuance of Atlantic tunas and HMS vessel permits. To apply for or renew an Atlantic tunas or HMS vessel permit, visit www.hmspermits.gov or dial (888) 872-8862.

LARGE PELAGICS SURVEY

NMFS collects data on fishing effort and catch for BFT and other pelagic fishes through the Large Pelagics Survey (LPS). Through telephone interviews (biweekly for private vessels and weekly for charter vessels), NMFS obtains information about fishing activity directed at large pelagic fishes. Captains are selected randomly from the permit list and may be contacted more than once during the fishing season. The telephone survey includes only questions about the number of fishing trips for the previous 2 weeks (1 week for charter vessels). In addition, field surveys collect biological samples and catch data for estimating annual catches of tunas and other large pelagic fishes.

Collection of information about recreational catch of Atlantic tunas is essential for stock assessments and reports to ICCAT. Cooperation with LPS dockside and telephone interviewers is required under the authority of ATCA. Note that the LPS will be used as independent validation of the Automated Landings Reporting System (ALRS) for BFT, thus a small degree of duplication is unavoidable. INDIVIDUAL CATEGORY INFORMATION

All fishing for any species must cease and the vessel must immediately return to port to offload when the large medium or giant BFT (>73") daily retention limit is retained or possessed under regulations pertaining to the General, HMS Charter/Headboat, and HMS Angling category fisheries, as applicable. In the case of multi-day trips, the daily limit applies and may not be exceeded at any point during the trip. DIRECTED FISHING FOR BFT IN THE GULF OF MEXICO IS PROHIBITED. Landing BFT > 73" is allowed in the Gulf of Mexico only under the HMS Angling category "trophy" and Longline category retention limits. Authorized gear for Atlantic tunas: Rod and reel (including downriggers), handline, greenstick gear, speargun (recreational only and only for tunas other than BFT), harpoon, bandit gear, longlines, traps (pound nets and fish weirs), and purse seines. Gear type restrictions for BFT are specified below.



LANDINGS INFORMATION

CURVED FORK LENGTH (CFL) MEASUREMENT

For enforcement purposes, total curved fork length is the sole criterion for determining the size class of whole (with head) Atlantic tunas. Measurements must be taken in a line, tracing the contour of the body from the tip of the upper jaw to the fork of the tail, which abuts the dorsal insertion of the pectoral fin and the dorsal side of the caudal keel. Measurements must be taken from the dorsal insertion of the pectoral fin, tracing the contour of the body, to the fork of the tail. THE TAPE MUST TOUCH THE TOP PORTION OF THE PECTORAL FIN.



LANDING FORM

Atlantic tunas may be landed round with fins intact, or eviscerated with the head removed, but with one pectoral fin and the tail remaining attached. The upper and lower lobes of the tuna tail may be removed for storage purposes as long as the fork of the tail remains intact.

For tunas with heads removed, pectoral fin curved fork length (PFCFL) must be taken. For BFT, the conversion factor to obtain total curved fork length is 1.35, i.e., PFCFL x 1.35=total curved fork length. No person may retain or possess a BFT with the head removed that is less than 20 inches, PFCFL.

The minimum size for yellowfin and bigeye tuna is 27 inches curved fork length. No person may remove the head of a bigeye tuna or yellowfin tuna if the remaining portion would be less than 27 inches from the fork of the tail to the forward edge of the cut.

Landings of all BFT must be reported. If sold, the landings of large medium and giant BFT must be reported by a licensed dealer on landing cards faxed to the NMFS Northeast Regional Office. BFT not sold by commercial permit holders must be reported to the nearest NMFS Enforcement office upon landing. Recreational landings of large medium and giant ("trophy") BFT must be reported as indicated in the HMS Angling category reporting at right side of page.
