## Captain Linda Y. Bunn

### Staff Judge Advocate, U.S. European Command

Born and raised in Warner, New Hampshire, Captain Bunn was commissioned in the Navy through the JAG Corps Student Program in 1987. She received her law degree in 1988 from Franklin Pierce Law School in Concord, NH, and a Masters of Law degree in 1997 from the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA.

Captain Bunn assumed her duties as Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) for U. S. European Command (EUCOM) in September 2010. Before reporting to EUCOM, she was the Force Judge Advocate in Naples, Italy for U. S. Naval Forces Europe/Africa and U.S. Sixth Fleet (2009-2010).

Captain Bunn was the Commanding Officer, Region Legal Service Office (RLSO) Mid-Atlantic in Norfolk, VA from 2007 to 2009. She served as the Deputy Legislative Counsel at the Navy's Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA) in Washington, D.C. concentrating on personnel issues from 2005-2007 and as the Executive Officer at the Navy Legal Service Office (NLSO), North Central from 2003 to 2005. In addition to these assignments, Captain Bunn served in Washington, D.C. in the General Litigation Division of the Office of the Judge Advocate General (OJAG), representing the U.S. Navy in federal litigation and as the administrative assistant to the U.S. Navy JAG, Rear Admiral H.E. Grant.

After Captain Bunn earned her Masters of Law at the University of Virginia she served as the environmental counsel for the U.S. Navy Southeast Region and then as environmental counsel to the Commander, U.S. Fleet Forces Command and Commander, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, Norfolk, VA.

Captain Bunn has served in a variety of billets before moving to senior level billets. In November 1992, she reported to Naval Justice School (NJS) where she initially taught Civil law and then assumed responsibility as the department head for the NJS Procedure Division. While at NJS she was heavily involved in the DOD/DoS teaching programs in Cambodia and Latvia. Captain Bunn began her career at Naval Air Station Jacksonville, Florida first as a defense counsel, then as a prosecutor eventually assuming responsibility as the senior trial (prosecution) counsel. In August 1990, she was assigned to the NLSO, Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines where she served as defense and then the senior trial (prosecution) counsel. Captain Bunn also served as station judge advocate for Naval Air Station Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines, until the base was closed in 1992.

Captain Bunn is admitted to practice before the courts of the State of New Hampshire and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. She is married to Colonel David Bunn, USMCR.
