

Report Overview

During the calendar year of 2010, programs funded under the Workforce Investment Act saw nearly 300,000 trainings complete (165,154 Adult and 128,877 Dislocated Workers). Of these trainings, roughly 70 percent of the individual records located in the Workforce Investment Act Standard Record Data (WIASRD) were accompanied with a valid occupation of training code. The following analysis uses this variable to show total number of trainees, total number who found employment, the entered employment rate, and whether the occupation met the O*NET definition of a "Bright Outlook" Occupation.

Bright Outlook Occupations must fit one of the following criteria:

- Projected to grow much faster than average (employment increase of 20% or more) over the period 2008-2018 (occupational projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics).
- Projected to have 100,000 or more job openings over the period 2008-2018
- New & Emerging occupation in a high growth industry

Looking at Bright Outlook Occupations does provide a good view at how ETA is aligning their training services with high-demand occupations, it does come with some limitations. For example, to establish a "true" high-demand occupation list, this must be done at a local level as many occupations' demand will vary greatly by different geographic regions (i.e. what is considered high-demand in part of the country may not be considered as such in another). Secondly, since this national list focuses on growing occupations, there are a few occupations that do not appear on this list, but currently provide family-sustaining wages with growth potential. Some of these occupations include: Health Care Support Workers, Computer and Systems Information Managers, Production Managers/Supervisors, and Computer Specialists and Computer Programmers.

Quick Facts

- All of the top 10 occupations of training for WIA Dislocated Workers were considered a Bright Outlook Occupation. Eight of the top 10 WIA Adult occupations of training fell into this group.
- Over 70 percent of training offered under WIA were considered to be a Bright Outlook Occupation, with many more falling into excellent career occupations like the ones mentioned above.
- Truck Drivers, Nursing Aides, and Licensed Nurse Practitioners (LPN) made up the top three occupations of training.

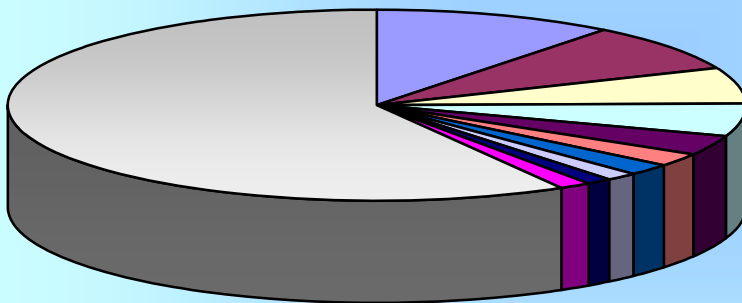
How to Use this Document

The "Adults" and "DW" tabs each represent the most recent available data regarding WIA training completers organized by the occupation in which they received training. The first two columns on each table show the total number of individuals who gained employment and the entered employment rate. The next column shows the total number of training completers, followed by the Bright Outlook Occupation indicator, and finally the rank by total training completers. The final tab is a comprehensive list of all the Bright Outlook Occupations.

Data is taken from the Workforce Investment Act Standard Record Data (WIASRD) Program Year 2011 First Quarter file. All program completers (exitors) are taken from 1/1/2010 - 12/31/2010.

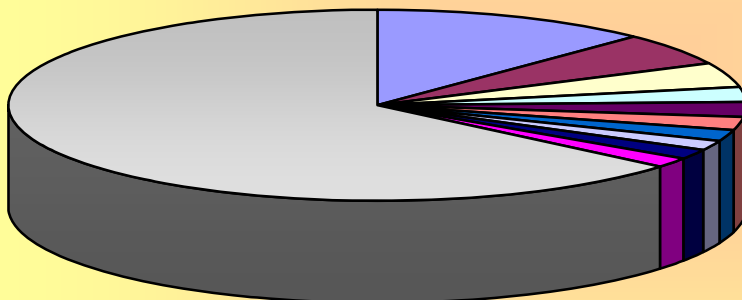
Top Ten Occupations of Training in WIA Adult and Dislocated Worker Programs: Training Completers from 1/1/2010 - 12/31/2010
