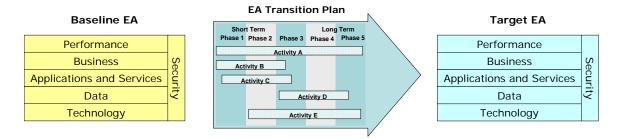
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1.0 Introduction

BBG/VOA's Enterprise Architecture Transition Plan (EATP) identifies and sequences transition activities at the strategic level. It is not a detailed project plan and does not encompass a work breakdown structure for all of the operational activities required to realize the desired target state. Detailed implementation planning for individual transition activities is the responsibility of the program and project managers tasked with executing those portions of the plan. The EATP focuses solely on the individual transition activities. It contains an updated transition sequencing chart, and summary information for each transition activity.

The Enterprise Architecture Transition Plan is a high-level strategic roadmap for information technology modernization. It is a plan to achieve BBG/VOA's Target Enterprise Architecture (EA) including target performance goals, business processes, applications and services, technology, data, and security. A simple conceptual representation is provided in figure 1 below.

1.1 Intended Audience

BBG/VOA's Transition Plan presents a high-level roadmap for moving VOA toward the Target EA. All VOA executives, managers, and staff are encouraged to read, discuss, and comment on this document. The primary focus for specific VOA stakeholder groups is summarized below:

- VOA Executives As the primary force within VOA responsible for ensuring that the agency fulfills its mission and progresses toward its vision, VOA executives must understand and support the roadmap set forth in the Transition Plan and participate in efforts to implement it.
- IT Directorate/VOA Program and Business managers All IT Directorate and VOA program managers should be familiar with Transition Plan. As members of the office with primary responsibility for planning and deploying systems and technology in support of the Agency's business,

- program and business managers need to understand the transition activities required to move VOA to the Target EA:
- The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) As part of the budget submission process, BBG will submit the Transition Plan and other EA work products to OMB. OMB will use the Transition Plan to determine whether BBG has a cohesive roadmap to shift VOA to the Target EA.

2.0 Segment Architecture and the Federal Transition Frame Work

OMB's Chief Federal Enterprise Architect introduced two strategic priorities into the federal enterprise architecture. They are segment architecture and the Federal Transition Framework (FTF). Agencies are now required to develop mission-focused EA segments of their core business activities, and integrate the cross-agency initiatives from the FTF (e.g. HSPD-12, IPv6) into their agency's target architecture.

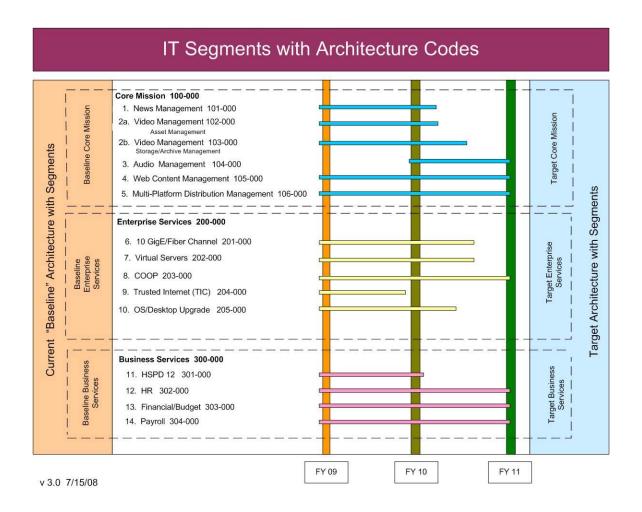
2.1 EA Transition Plan and Segment Sequencing

The 2009 EATP plan defines and sequences segment transition activities within three categories:

- Core Mission These activities are associated with developing and implementing a detailed architecture for a mission area (e.g. Multi-Media System). A core mission area represents a *strategic view* of VOA's business (i.e., why VOA exists).
- Enterprise Services These activities are associated with developing and implementing a next generation IT Infrastructure (e.g. IPV6).
- **Business Services** These activities are associated with identifying, selecting, planning for, and implementing Support services (e.g. Payroll).

Figure 2 shows a high-level view of all 14 transition segment activities addressed in this EATP. The overview displays transition activities by type (i.e., overarching activities, mission areas, enterprise services and business services) for each fiscal year in the planning period.

3.0 Transition Activity Details

This section of the Transition Plan provides a brief overview for each transition activity identified and sequenced. The following information has been collected for each transition activity:

- **Description** This field contains a brief summary explaining the scope of the transition activity.
- **Implementation Schedule** Identifies the fiscal year the transition activity is to be initiated.
- **Sponsor(s)** Identifies the champion(s)/benefactor(s) for the transition activity.
- **Major Investment(s)** Identifies the major investment(s) found in the IT Portfolio associated to the transition activity.
- **Program or Project Managers** Identifies the transition activities that need or are impacted by this transition activity.
- **Dependences or Relationships** Identifies the transition activities that this transition activity needs or is impacted by.
