To control the spread of head lice, your child may return to school after he/she has been treated with a pediculocide shampoo. This is only the first step. The brushes and combs your child has used with in the last week will need to be soaked in the pediculocide shampoo for 1 hour. Bedding, clothing, and hats must be laundered in very hot water (120°) on the same day or evening that your child is treated. As a precaution, stuffed animals, pillows, or other items that cannot be washed should be placed inside a plastic bag and sealed for one week. Ideally nits should be removed. If not, reshampooing in 7-10 days is vital to kill newly hatched lice.
