Course Requisites

- To qualify for admissions, learners should provide their most recent scores from the Defense Language Proficiency Test; or equivalent record of prior training in the language
- Although no prior distance learning experience is necessary, students should have solid computer skills.
- Regular class attendance, satisfactory completion of the asynchronous self-study component and homework assignments are required to earn a Certificate of Completion
- Pre-Course and End-of-Course Diagnostic Assessment will be administered to provide individual learner profiles and to build subsequent training plans
- A program evaluation survey will be completed at the end of the course


