RESOLUTION

- Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2021) to amend the Clean Air Act regarding air pollution from Outer Continental Shelf activities, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1249) to amend title 35, United States Code, to provide for patent reform.
 - 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
 - 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
 - 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
 - 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
 - 5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2021) to amend the Clean Air Act

regarding air pollution from Outer Continental Shelf ac-1 2 tivities. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed 3 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill 4 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill 5 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-6 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the 7 Committee on Energy and Commerce. After general de-8 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the 9 five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read. All 10 points of order against provisions in the bill are waived. No amendment to the bill shall be in order except those 11 12 printed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules 13 accompanying this resolution. Each such amendment may be offered only in the order printed in the report, may 14 15 be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time 16 17 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to 18 19 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-20sion of the question in the House or in the Committee 21 of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments 22 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill 23 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the 24 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been 25 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
with or without instructions.

4 SEC. 2. At any time after the adoption of this resolu-5 tion the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of 6 7 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-8 ation of the bill (H.R. 1249) to amend title 35, United 9 States Code, to provide for patent reform. The first read-10 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. An initial pe-11 12 riod of general debate shall be confined to the question 13 of the constitutionality of the bill and shall not exceed 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by Representative 14 15 Smith of Texas and Representative Kaptur of Ohio or their respective designees. A subsequent period of general 16 17 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed 18 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and 19 ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judici-20ary. After general debate the bill shall be considered for 21 amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order 22 to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amend-23 ment under the five-minute rule the amendment in the na-24 ture of a substitute recommended by the Committee on 25 the Judiciary now printed in the bill. The committee

amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-1 2 ered as read. All points of order against the committee 3 amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived. No 4 amendment to the committee amendment in the nature 5 of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-6 7 panying this resolution. Each such amendment may be of-8 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-9 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall 10 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the 11 12 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-13 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the 14 15 Whole. All points of order against such amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for 16 17 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill 18 to the House with such amendments as may have been 19 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the 20House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of 21 the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in 22 the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be 23 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto 24 to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with or without instructions. 25

1 SEC. 3. Upon receipt of a message from the Senate transmitting H.R. 1249 with a Senate amendment or 2 amendments thereto, it shall be in order to consider in 3 4 the House without intervention of any point of order a 5 single motion offered by the chair of the Committee on the Judiciary or his designee that the House disagree to 6 7 the Senate amendment or amendments and request or 8 agree to a conference with the Senate thereon. The motion 9 shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the 10 Committee on the Judiciary. The previous question shall 11 12 be considered as ordered on the motion to its adoption without intervening motion or demand for division of the 13 14 question.
