RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5) to improve patient access to health care services and provide improved medical care by reducing the excessive burden the liability system places on the health care delivery system.

- 1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
- 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
- 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
- 5 ation of the bill (H.R. 5) to improve patient access to

health care services and provide improved medical care by reducing the excessive burden the liability system places 3 on the health care delivery system. The first reading of 4 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall 6 be confined to the bill and amendments specified in this resolution and shall not exceed six hours equally divided 8 among and controlled by the respective chairs and ranking minority members of the Committees on Energy and Com-10 merce, the Judiciary, and Ways and Means. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under 12 the five-minute rule. In lieu of the amendments recommended by the Committees on Energy and Commerce 14 and the Judiciary now printed in the bill, an amendment 15 in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 112–18 shall be considered as adopted 16 in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as the original bill 18 for the purpose of further amendment under the five-19 20 minute rule and shall be considered as read. All points 21 of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No further amendment to the bill, as amended, 23 shall be in order except those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such further amendment may be offered only in the order

- 1 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
- 2 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall
- 3 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
- 4 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
- 5 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-
- 6 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House
- 7 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order
- 8 against such further amendments are waived. At the con-
- 9 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
- 10 Committee shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to
- 11 the House with such further amendments as may have
- 12 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered
- 13 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and any further
- 14 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening
- 15 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
- 16 structions.

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
