RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 112) establishing the budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2013 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2014 through 2022, and providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

- 1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
- 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 112) es-3 tablishing the budget for the United States Government 4 for fiscal year 2013 and setting forth appropriate budg-5 etary levels for fiscal years 2014 through 2022. The first 6 reading of the concurrent resolution shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the con-8 current resolution are waived. General debate shall not exceed four hours, with three hours of general debate con-10 fined to the congressional budget equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the 12 Committee on the Budget and one hour of general debate on the subject of economic goals and policies equally divided and controlled by Representative Brady of Texas 14 15 and Representative Hinchey of New York or their respective designees. After general debate the concurrent resolu-16 tion shall be considered for amendment under the five-18 minute rule. The concurrent resolution shall be considered as read. No amendment shall be in order except those 19 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-21 panying this resolution. Each amendment may be offered 22 only in the order printed in the report, may be offered 23 only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, and shall be debatable for the time speci-

fied in the report equally divided and controlled by the

- 1 proponent and an opponent. All points of order against
- 2 such amendments are waived except that the adoption of
- 3 an amendment in the nature of a substitute shall con-
- 4 stitute the conclusion of consideration of the concurrent
- 5 resolution for amendment. After the conclusion of consid-
- 6 eration of the concurrent resolution for amendment and
- 7 a final period of general debate, which shall not exceed
- 8 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and
- 9 ranking minority member of the Committee on the Budg-
- 10 et, the Committee shall rise and report the concurrent res-
- 11 olution to the House with such amendment as may have
- 12 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered
- 13 as ordered on the concurrent resolution and amendments
- 14 thereto to adoption without intervening motion except
- 15 amendments offered by the chair of the Committee on the
- 16 Budget pursuant to section 305(a)(5) of the Congressional
- 17 Budget Act of 1974 to achieve mathematical consistency.
- 18 The concurrent resolution shall not be subject to a demand
- 19 for division of the question of its adoption.
- SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time on the legisla-
- 21 tive day of March 29, 2012, for the Speaker to entertain
- 22 motions that the House suspend the rules, as though
- 23 under clause 1 of rule XV, relating to a measure extending
- 24 expiring surface transportation authority.
