Mr. NUGENT, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3523) to provide for the sharing of certain cyber threat intelligence and cyber threat information between the intelligence community and cybersecurity entities, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4628) to extend student loan interest rates for undergraduate Federal Direct Stafford Loans; and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3523) to provide for the sharing  
6 of certain cyber threat intelligence and cyber threat infor-  
7 mation between the intelligence community and cybersecu-  
8 rity entities, and for other purposes. The first reading of  
9 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against  
10 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall  
11 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
12 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-  
13 ity member of the Permanent Select Committee on Intel-  
14 ligence. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
15 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the  
16 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
17 the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence now  
18 printed in the bill, it shall be in order to consider as an  
19 original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-  
20 minute rule an amendment in the nature of a substitute  
21 consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 112-20.  
22 That amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be  
23 considered as read. All points of order against that amend-  
24 ment in the nature of a substitute are waived. No amend-  
25 ment to that amendment in the nature of a substitute

1 shall be in order except those printed in the report of the  
2 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each  
3 such amendment may be offered only in the order printed  
4 in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated  
5 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-  
6 able for the time specified in the report equally divided  
7 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall  
8 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to  
9 a demand for division of the question in the House or in  
10 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against  
11 such amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consid-  
12 eration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
13 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
14 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a  
15 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted  
16 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the amend-  
17 ment in the nature of a substitute made in order as origi-  
18 nal text. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
19 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage  
20 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit  
21 with or without instructions.

22       SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time through the  
23 legislative day of April 27, 2012, for the Speaker to enter-  
24 tain motions that the House suspend the rules, as though

1 under clause 1 of rule XV, relating to the following meas-  
2 ures:

3 (a) The bill (H.R. 2096) to advance cybersecurity re-  
4 search, development, and technical standards, and for  
5 other purposes.

6 (b) The bill (H.R. 3834) to amend the High-Perform-  
7 ance Computing Act of 1991 to authorize activities for  
8 support of networking and information technology re-  
9 search, and for other purposes.

10 (c) The bill (H.R. 4257) to amend chapter 35 of title  
11 44, United States Code, to revise requirements relating  
12 to Federal information security, and for other purposes.

13 SEC. 3. Upon the adoption of this resolution it shall  
14 be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 4628)  
15 to extend student loan interest rates for undergraduate  
16 Federal Direct Stafford Loans. All points of order against  
17 consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be con-  
18 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in  
19 the bill are waived. The previous question shall be consid-  
20 ered as ordered on the bill and any amendment thereto  
21 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
22 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
23 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Edu-  
24 cation and the Workforce; and (2) one motion to recom-  
25 mit.

1        SEC. 4. The Committee on Appropriations may, at  
2 any time before 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 2, 2012, file  
3 privileged reports to accompany measures making appro-  
4 priations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013.

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
