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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6079) to repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and health care-related provisions in the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 6079) to repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable  
4 Care Act and health care-related provisions in the Health  
5 Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010. All points  
6 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. The

1 bill shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
2 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question  
3 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and any amend-  
4 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion  
5 except: (1) five hours of debate, with 30 minutes equally  
6 divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and Minor-  
7 ity Leader or their respective designees, 60 minutes equal-  
8 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-  
9 ity member of the Committee on Education and the Work-  
10 force, 60 minutes equally divided and controlled by the  
11 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
12 Energy and Commerce, 60 minutes equally divided and  
13 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
14 the Committee on Ways and Means, 30 minutes equally  
15 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
16 member of the Committee on the Budget, 30 minutes  
17 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking  
18 minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary, and  
19 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and  
20 ranking minority member of the Committee on Small  
21 Business; and (2) one motion to recommit.



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
