MOTION TO RECOMMIT

M . moves to recommit the bill, H.R. 5743, to the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendment: After section 501 (page 21, after line 14), insert the following new section: 1 SEC. **PROTECTING** 502. UNITED **STATES MILITARY** 2 STRENGTH, TECHNOLOGICAL PROWESS, AND 3 AMERICAN JOBS. 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—In obligating and expending funds 5 authorized to be appropriated by this Act, the head of each element of the intelligence community shall take all steps 6 necessary to protect and ensure that— 7 8 (1) the intelligence and military capability of 9 the United States is not improperly transferred to or 10 stolen by a foreign nation or a state sponsor of ter-11 rorism; 12 (2) the intelligence and military capability of 13 the United States and sensitive information per-14 taining to economic, financial, and consumer infor-

mation is protected from cybersecurity attacks, in-

1	cluding cybersecurity attacks from Iran and China;

3	(3) contracts and work performed for such ele-
4	ment of the intelligence community is first provided
5	to United States companies and workers and not
6	outsourced to foreign-owned companies, unless the
7	Director of National Intelligence determines that it
8	is in the interests of national security.
9	(b) STATE SPONSOR OF TERRORISM DEFINED.—In
10	this section, the term "state sponsor of terrorism" means
11	any country the government of which the Secretary of
12	State determines has repeatedly provided support for acts
13	of international terrorism pursuant to section 6(j) of the
14	Export Administration Act of 1979 (as continued in effect
15	pursuant to the International Emergency Economic Pow-
16	ers Act), section 40 of the Arms Export Control Act, sec-
17	tion 620A of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, or any
18	other provision of law.
