Porcelain-on-Steel Cooking Ware From China and Taiwan (Investigations Nos. 731-TA-298 and 299 (Second Review)); Top-of-the-Stove Stainless Steel Cooking Ware From Korea and Taiwan (Investigations Nos. 701-TA-267 and 268 and 731-TA-304 and 305 (Second Review))

DETERMINATIONS

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (Commission) determines, pursuant to section 751(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)) (the Act), that revocation of the antidumping duty orders on porcelain-onsteel cooking ware from China and Taiwan would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time. The Commission also determines that revocation of the antidumping and countervailing duty orders on top-of-the-stove stainless steel cooking ware from Korea would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time,² and that revocation of the antidumping and countervailing duty orders on top-of-the-stove stainless steel cooking ware from Taiwan would not be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material states within a reasonably foreseeable time, steel cooking ware from Taiwan would not be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted these reviews on March 1, 2005 (70 F.R. 9974) and determined on June 6, 2005 that it would conduct expedited reviews (70 F.R. 35708, June 21, 2005).

The Commission transmitted its determinations in these reviews to the Secretary of Commerce on October 27, 2005. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 3808 (October 2005), entitled *Porcelain-on-Steel Cooking Ware From China and Taiwan, and Top-of-the-Stove Stainless Steel Cooking Ware From Korea and Taiwan* (Investigation Nos. 731-TA-298 and 299 (Second Review) and Investigation Nos. 701-TA-267 and 268 and 731-TA-304 and 305 (Second Review)).
