Plaintiff, the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("Commission"), has filed a Complaint for permanent injunction and other relief, and moved pursuant to Section 6c of the Commodity Exchange Act, as amended (the "Act"), 7 U.S.C. § 13a-1 (2002) and Rule 7.1 of the



S.D. Fla. L. R. for a Statutory Restraining Order ("Order") prohibiting Defendants and Relief Defendants from, among other things, dissipating, concealing, transferring, or otherwise disposing of any funds, assets and other property; and prohibiting Defendants and Relief Defendants from destroying, altering or disposing of, or refusing to permit authorized representatives of the Commission to inspect and copy, when and as requested, any books, records, electronically stored data, including computers and computer data, or other documents wherever they may be; and appointment of a temporary receiver. Additionally, the Commission has moved for ancillary relief, including and an accounting, repatriation of the Defendants' and Relief Defendants' assets and expedited discovery.

As it appears to the Court that it has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, that Section 6c of the Act, 7 U.S.C. § 13a-1 (2002), authorizes *ex parte* relief, that there is good cause to believe that the Defendants have engaged in, are engaging in or are about to engage in violations of the Act, and that this is a proper case for granting an *ex parte* statutory restraining order to preserve the *status quo*, protect public customers from loss and damage, and enable the Commission to fulfill its statutory duties, the Court orders as follows:

DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Order, the following definitions apply:

1. The term "document" is synonymous in meaning and equal in scope to the usage of the term in Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 34(a), and includes, but is not limited to, writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, audio and video recordings, computer records (including, but not limited to, floppy diskettes, hard disks, ZIP disks, CD-ROMs, optical discs, backup tapes, printer buffers, smart cards, memory calculators, pagers, personal digital assistants such as Palm Pilot computers, as well as printouts or readouts

from any magnetic storage device), and other data compilations from which information can be obtained and translated, if necessary, through detection devices into reasonably usable form. A draft or non-identical copy is a separate document within the meaning of the term.

- 2. "Defendant(s)" means Doreen Rose Valko, Frank A. DeSantis, a.k.a. Josh Anthony,
 International Investments Holdings Corp and any person insofar as he or she is acting in
 the capacity of their officer, agent, servant, employee or attorney, and any person who
 receives actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise insofar as he or she
 is acting in concert or participating with them.
- 3. "Relief Defendant(s)" means Jason Todd Dean, Tara Lyn Dean, Joseph Valko, Jeffery Paul Jedlicki, Tirtza Jedlicki, Thomas W. Yoos, Jr., Erin R. DeSantis, a.k.a. Erin Rose Valko, ERV & Associates, Inc., Joe Valko Enterprises, Inc., Boot Camp Diet & Fitness, Inc., American Lighthouse Trading, Inc., Certified Financial Services, Inc., John Taddeo Enterprises, Inc., Jason's Roofing and Waterproofing, Inc. and any person insofar as he or she is acting in the capacity of their officer, agent, servant, employee or attorney, and any person who receives actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise insofar as he or she is acting in concert or participating with them.

I. Asset Freeze

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Defendants are restrained and enjoined from directly or indirectly:

A. Transferring, selling, alienating, liquidating, encumbering, pledging, leasing, loaning, assigning, concealing, dissipating, converting, withdrawing, or otherwise disposing of any funds, assets or other property, wherever located, including assets held outside the United States, except as otherwise ordered by the Court;

Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit boxes titled in the name or subject to access by any of the Defendants.

II. Directives to Financial Institutions

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any financial or brokerage institution, business entity, or person that holds, controls, or maintains custody of any account or asset titled in the name of, held for the benefit of, or otherwise under the control of any Defendant, or has held, controlled, or maintained custody of any such account or asset of any Defendant at any time shall:

- A. Prohibit Defendants and all other persons from withdrawing, removing, assigning, transferring, pledging, encumbering, disbursing, dissipating, converting, selling or otherwise disposing of any such asset except as directed by further order of the Court;
- B. Deny Defendants and all other persons access to any safe deposit box that is:
 - 1. titled in the name of any Defendant either individually or jointly, or
 - 2. otherwise subject to access by any Defendant,

Notwithstanding this Paragraph, the Receiver appointed herein shall be provided with access to any safe deposit box titled in the name of, or subject to access by, the Defendants;

- C. Provide Counsel for the Commission, within five (5) business days of receiving a copy of this Order, a statement setting forth:
 - the identification number of each such account or asset titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any of the Defendants, or held on behalf of, or for the benefit of, any of the Defendants, or under the control of any of the Defendants, either individually or jointly;

- 2. the balance of each such account, or a description of the nature and value of such asset as of the close of business on the day on which this Order is served, and, if the account or other asset has been closed or removed, the date closed or removed, the total funds removed in order to close the account, and the name of the person or entity to whom such account or other asset was remitted; and
- 3. the identification of any safe deposit box that is either titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or is otherwise subject to access by any Defendant;
- D. Upon request by the Commission, promptly provide the Commission with copies of all records or other documentation pertaining to such account or asset, including, but not limited to, originals or copies of account applications, account statements, signature cards, checks, drafts, deposit tickets, transfers to and from the accounts, all other debit and credit instruments or slips, currency transaction reports, 1099 forms, and safe deposit box logs; and
- E. Cooperate with all reasonable requests of the Commission and/or Receiver relating to implementation of this Order.

III. Accounting

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within five (5) business days following the service of this Order, each Defendant shall:

A. Provide the Commission and/or Receiver with a full accounting of all funds, assets and other property wherever situated, both in and outside the United States which are (1) titled in the name individually or jointly of such Defendant; or (2)

held by any person or entity, for the benefit of any Defendant; or (3) under such Defendant direct or indirect control, either individually or jointly;

IV. Repatriation

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within five (5) business days following the service of this Order, each Defendant shall:

- A. Transfer to the territory of the United States all funds, documents, and assets located in foreign countries which are (1) titled in the name individually or jointly of such Defendant; or (2) held by any person or entity, for the benefit of any Defendant; or (3) under such Defendant direct or indirect control, either individually or jointly;
- B. Provide the Commission and/or Receiver access to all records of accounts or assets of the Defendants held by financial institutions located outside the territorial United States.

V. Books and Records

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, immediately upon service of this Order upon them,

Defendants and any other person or entity served with a copy of this Order, shall immediately

deliver over to the Commission, Receiver, or the Commission's representative:

- A. Possession and custody of documents of the Defendants, including but not limited to, all books and records of accounts, all financial and accounting records, balance sheets, income statements, bank records (including monthly statements, canceled checks, records of wire transfers, and check registers), client lists, title documents and other papers;
- B. Possession and custody of all precious metals, other commodities, funds, and

- other assets being held by or on behalf of the Defendants and or on behalf of the Defendants' customers;
- C. All keys, computer passwords, entry codes, and combinations to locks necessary to gain or to secure access to any of the assets or documents of the Defendants including but not limited to, access to the Defendants' business premises, means of communication, accounts, computer systems, or other property; and
- D. Information identifying the accounts, employees, properties or other assets or obligations of the Defendants.

VI. Maintenance of Books and Records

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendants and all persons or entities who receive notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, are restrained and enjoined from directly or indirectly destroying, mutilating, erasing, altering, concealing or disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any documents that relate to the business practices or business or personal finances of any Defendant.

VII. Access to Books and Records

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that representatives of the Commission and/or the Receiver be immediately allowed to inspect and copy the books, records, and other documents of the Defendants and their agents including, but not limited to, paper documents, electronically stored data, tape recordings, and computer discs, wherever they may be situated and whether they are in the possession of the Defendants or others, and to copy said documents, data and records, either on or off the premises where they may be situated.

VIII. Appointment of a Receiver

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Court will defer ruling on the appointment on a

temporary receiver. Plaintiff's are hereby directed to submit names of potential temporary receivers who are qualified and interested in such an appointment no later than January 11, 2006.

IX. Expedited Discovery

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties are granted leave, at any time after service of this Order, to take the deposition of and demand the production of documents from any person or entity for the purpose of discovering the nature, location, status, and extent of assets of the Defendants, and the location of documents reflecting the business transactions of the Defendants.

X. Expedited Discovery Procedures

sufficient for any such deposition and five (5) days notice shall be deemed sufficient for the production of any such documents; b) the limitations and conditions set forth in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2)(B) regarding subsequent depositions of an individual shall not apply to depositions taken pursuant to this Order; c) no depositions taken pursuant to this paragraph shall count towards the ten deposition limit set forth in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2)(A); and pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2), the parties are granted leave to take the depositions of Defendants confined in prison.

XI. Service of Order

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that copies of this Order may be served by any means, including facsimile transmission, upon any financial institution or other entity or person that may have possession, custody, or control of any assets or documents of any Defendant or their agents and upon any person that may be subject to any provision of this Order, and, additionally, that representatives of the Plaintiff are specially appointed by the Court to effect service of this

Order. Service of the summons, Complaint or other process may be effected in accordance with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4.

XII. Service on the Commission

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendants and Relief Defendants shall serve all pleadings, filings, correspondence, notices required by this Order, and other materials on the Commission by delivering a copy to Timothy J. Mulreany, Chief Trial Attorney, Division of Enforcement, Commodity Futures Trading Commission, 1155 21st Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20581.

XIII. Bond Not Required Of Plaintiff

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Commission is an agency of the United States of America and, accordingly, no bond need be posted by the Commission.

XIV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order shall remain in full force and effect until further order of this Court, and that this Court retains jurisdiction of this matter for all purposes. For the reasons asserted by the Court during the hearing on the instant Motion held on January 4, 2006, the Court will defer ruling on Plaintiff's Motion as it pertains to the Relief Defendants until additional affidavits and/or evidence are provided to the Court.
