# Application Submission FY 2008

- ALFD Workload for FY 2008:
  - Certificates of Label Approval
     (COLAs) 133,427
  - Malt Beverage COLAs Only 10,144
  - COLAs Online 6,948
  - Paper Applications 3,196
  - The timeframe for processing COLAs Online is half that of processing paper applications

# Legal Authority

- Federal Alcohol Administration Act (FAA Act, 27 U.S.C. Chapter 8)
- Alcoholic Beverage Labeling Act of 1988 (Government warning statement)
- Webb-Kenyon Act (27 U.S.C. Sec. 122)
- Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C. Chapter 51 and Section 5051)

#### Specific Regulatory Authority for Malt Beverages

- Alcoholic Beverage Labeling Act of 1988 – 27 U.S.C. 213, et seq.

     Warning Statement
- FAA Act 27 U.S.C. 205

### Certificates of Label Approval (COLAs)

- TTB's statutory mandate:
  - To prevent consumer deception, and
  - To ensure that alcohol beverage labels provide consumers with adequate information as to the identity and quality of the product

#### Mandatory Label Information

#### **Brand Label:**

- Brand Name
- Class
- Name and Address (domestic)
- Net Contents
- Alcohol Content (for Flavored Malt Beverages)

#### **Any Label:**

- Government Warning Statement
- Name and Address (Imported)
- Country of Origin
- Declaration of Aspartame
- Declaration of Sulfites
- FD&C Yellow #5

27 CFR 7.23, 7.24, 7.25, 7.27, and 7.22, respectively

27 CFR 16.21-22, 7.25, and 7.22, respectively

#### Mandatory Label Information (Continued)

- Brand Name Name under which the malt beverage is marketed
- Class and Type Specific identity of the malt beverage; e.g., beer, ale, porter, stout, malt liquor, cereal beer, near beer
- Name and Address City and State of bottler/packer

#### Mandatory Label Information (Continued)

- Net Contents Must be expressed in English units of measure; e.g., fluid ounces, pints, quarts, gallons
- Alcohol Content Optional, unless required by State law; mandatory when any alcohol comes from added flavors

### **Alcohol Content**

27 CFR 7.71

- Alcohol content statements may appear as:
  - ALCOHOL (ALC) \_\_\_% by VOLUME (VOL), or
  - ALCOHOL (ALC) by VOLUME (VOL) \_\_\_%, or
  - \_\_\_% ALCOHOL (ALC) by VOLUME (VOL), or
  - \_\_\_% ALCOHOL (ALC)/VOLUME (VOL)
- "ABV" is not acceptable

#### Mandatory Label Information (Continued)

- Must appear in readily legible printing on a completely contrasting background
- Must be in English
- Print size for containers larger than ½ pint is 2 millimeters
- Print size for alcohol content on containers larger ½ pint is 3 millimeters
- Print size for alcohol content on containers of 40 fl.
   oz. or larger is 4 millimeters

# Government Warning Statement

- Must be legible and on contrasting background
- Must be separate and apart from all other label text
- The words "GOVERNMENT WARNING" must appear in all capital letters and bold type

GOVERNMENT WARNING: (1) According to the Surgeon General, women should not drink alcoholic beverages during pregnancy because of the risk of birth defects. (2) Consumption of alcoholic beverages impairs your ability to drive a car or operate machinery, and may cause health problems.


### Non Alcoholic

- Product must contain less than 0.5 % alcohol by volume
- Label must state "contains less than 0.5% alcohol by volume" in direct conjunction with "Non Alcoholic"
- May not be labeled as "Beer," "Stout," "Lager,"
   "Ale," "Porter," "Malt Liquor," or "Lager Beer"
- Label must state "Non taxable under section 5051 I.R.C."

## **TTB Ruling 2008-3**

- Labeling jurisdiction of malt beverages requires the product contain both malted barley and hops (27 CFR 7.10)
- Labeling jurisdiction for products without malted barley and/or hops is regulated by the FDA
- Contact FDA at 301-436-2371
- TTB still retains jurisdiction over formulas and revenue collection

# Prohibited Practices 27 CFR 7.29

- Labels/cartons/cases shall not contain:
  - Any false or misleading information, especially relating to:
    - Irrelevant, scientific, or technical matters
    - Analyses or tests
    - Guarantees
    - Curative or therapeutic claims

### Prohibited Practices (Continued)

- Labels/cartons/cases shall not contain:
  - Obscene or indecent material
  - The U.S. flag or U.S. military or Government seals or emblems
  - The words "strong," "full strength," etc.
  - Numbers which may be construed to be alcohol content

NOTE: This is not an all-inclusive list.

# Allergen Disclosures 27 CFR 7.22 (a)

Food Allergen Labeling & Consumer
 Protection Act of 2004, signed into law July
 20, 2004, with effective date of January 1,
 2006

# Allergen Disclosures 27 CFR 7.22 (a)

 Under TTB's proposed regulations, producers, bottlers, and importers of alcohol beverages must declare on a product label the use of:

MilkEggs

Tree nutsSoybeans

PeanutsWheat

FishCrustacean Shellfish

 As well as ingredients that contain protein from these foods

# Allergen Disclosure 27 CFR 7.22(a)

- Under Interim Rule, effective 4/26/2006, voluntary labeling of major food allergens is allowed on the labels of alcohol beverages
- Allowed statements must read:
  - Contains: Milk, eggs, and fish
  - If one allergen is disclosed, then all allergens used in the production of the beverage must be disclosed

## Helpful Hints

- Paper applications must be printed on legal size paper
- Applications must be signed
- Do not make pen or ink changes, or use white-out on the labels
- If submitting labels for clear, acetate, etched, or painted labels, include a picture of a filled sample bottle

## Helpful Hints (Continued)

- Make sure labels are completely legible if we can't read them, we can't approve them
- Labels must be affixed to the front of the form; if labels do not fit in the space provided, they may be reduced, but copies must be legible (provide percentage of reduction in item #19)
- Provide translation for any foreign text on labels or in supporting documentation

## Helpful Hints (Continued)

- Include copies of any formula approvals, preimport letters, or lab analysis
- Include supporting documentation for organic labels
- Ensure current calendar year is shown on serial numbers
- Never use the class/type in the brand or fanciful name on the application form

- Check the list of allowable revisions to approved labels before re-submitting:
  - List can be found on page 3 of TTB F 5100.31
- Sign up for COLAs Online!
- Please do not print your labels prior to receiving label approval


