NMFS Announces a Proposed Rule to Modify the Retention of Incidentally-Caught Highly Migratory Species (HMS) in Atlantic Trawl Fisheries

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) proposes to modify the regulations governing the retention of incidentally-caught HMS in Atlantic trawl fisheries. Specifically, this action would address: (1) the permitting requirements for retention of incidentally-caught North Atlantic swordfish (*Xiphias gladius*) in squid trawl fisheries; and, (2) the retention of incidentally-caught species in the smoothhound shark complex (which includes smooth dogfish and Florida smoothhound (genus *Mustelus*)) in all Atlantic trawl fisheries.

The purpose of the proposed action is to reduce regulatory dead discards of incidentally-caught swordfish in the *Illex* squid trawl fishery by establishing a new Squid Trawl Incidental HMS permit, and to improve reporting and compliance with HMS regulations in all Atlantic squid trawl fisheries. The proposed rule also considers a retention limit for smoothhound sharks in Atlantic trawl fisheries. The intent of both of these actions is to reduce regulatory dead discards of HMS that are incidentally captured in trawl gears. The retention limit for smoothhounds in trawl fisheries would be implemented in conjunction with the smoothhound permit at the start of the 2012 smoothhound fishing season.
