Dear Mr. Chairman:

Section 414 of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-208) requires that we report to you annually on the number of Social Security numbers (SSN) we assigned to noncitizens who have not submitted evidence of employment authorization to us and under which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) reports earnings to us. Because we maintain earnings records on a calendar year basis, rather than a fiscal year basis, we based our report on 2010 earnings processed in calendar year 2011.

In 2011, we credited earnings under 432,365 nonwork SSNs. This number represents a decrease of 18,999 from 2010. Because we do not routinely learn of changes in noncitizens' work authorization status after we assign SSNs, the fact that IRS reports earnings to us for a nonwork SSN does not necessarily mean that the number holder performed unauthorized work.
