NCPC Hosts Panel Discussion on Security and Urban Design Post-9/11

In Preparation for Event NCPC Asks for Public Feedback on Existing Security Examples

Washington, DC – In the decade since 9/11, the security of buildings and public spaces has been a major focus in Washington. Temporary and permanent security features are now part of our daily experience.

On Monday, September 12, the National Capital Planning Commission will bring together a <u>panel of</u> <u>experts</u> to discuss current and emerging perimeter security practices and effective ways to balance security with good design to enhance the city's urban fabric.

Marcel Acosta, Executive Director, National Capital Planning Commission, will moderate.
