## Tonight: Public Invited to Help Update the Comprehensive Plan

**Washington, DC** – Do you have ideas about active commuting, bicycling, and/or federal facility location priorities? <u>Tonight, from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m.</u> NCPC will host a public forum to discuss these topics and more as part of draft policy updates proposed for the Federal Transportation and Workplace Elements of the *Comprehensive Plan for the National Capital*.

Members of the public are invited to review and comment on the draft policy updates at the meeting and online. *Public comments will be accepted through September 12.* 

The Comprehensive Plan for the National Capital Region is the principal policy document that guides planning and development in and around the National Capital Area. The Comp Plan is a unified plan comprised of two components – the Federal and District Elements. The Federal Elements are prepared by the National Capital Planning Commission, and provide a policy framework for the federal government in managing its operations and activity in the National Capital Region. The District Elements are prepared by the District of Columbia Office of Planning.
