
Re: Certification under Section 1201 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act

Dear Mr. Secretary:

This is in response to your letter, dated April 22, 2009, providing guidance on section 1201 certification and reporting under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. This letter provides amended Maintenance of Effort (MOE) certification amounts consistent with your recommended method of calculation.

Pursuant to title XII, section 1201, of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, Pub. L. 111-5 (February 17, 2009) ("ARRA"), I, Jennifer M. Granholm, the Governor of the state of Michigan, hereby certify to the Secretary of Transportation that the state of Michigan will maintain its efforts with regard to state funding for the types of projects in U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) "covered programs" funded under ARRA. The attached list (Attachment A) of DOT "covered programs" identifies the amount of funds that the state of Michigan plans to expend from its sources from February 17, 2009 to September 30, 2010 for the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA.

I understand that if the state of Michigan is unable to maintain the level of funding identified in this list for the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA, the state of Michigan will thereafter be prohibited by the Secretary of Transportation from receiving additional limitation on obligations for Federal-aid highway and highway safety construction programs that occurs after August 1 for Fiscal Year 2011.
