SUBJECT: Rider Orders for the United States Government Manual 2012 Edition, Revised September, 2012.

The GPO is providing this Circular Letter to announce the opportunity to submit orders for the United States Government Manual, 2012 edition, revised September 2012. The Government Manual provides comprehensive information on the agencies of the Legislative, Judicial, and Executive Branches. It also includes information on quasi-official agencies; international organizations in which the United States participates; and Federal boards, commissions, and committees.

The estimated rider rate for the 2012 edition printed publication is \$13.50 per copy. Please note that GPO will make every effort to include any orders (SF-1's) received after the October 15th deadline in the original printing at the rider rate pricing. However, due to the Government Manual production process and schedule, orders received late may be directed to the Superintendent of Documents for fulfillment at the higher post-production sales rates.

Rider rates apply to single destination, local delivery orders only. Mailing costs, if incurred, will be included as an additional charge. Unlike previous editions of the Manual, this edition and subsequent editions will not be automatically distributed by the National Archives and Records Administration through the Office of the Federal Register. If you wish to receive a copy of this publication it must be ordered through the Government Printing Office.

Send requisitions to GPO by October 15, 2012. The preferred method of submitting requisitions is to e-mail them to requisition@gpo.gov with the Jacket Number 226-897 in the Subject line. Please be sure to indicate the requisition No. and GPO jacket No. 226-897 on the SF-1 form.

Alternatively, requisitions can be faxed to 202-478-1762 or mailed to Agency Publishing COMSTAT, Stop CSA, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, DC 20401. Field or regional activities should coordinate their requirements with their Washington, DC area headquarters' printing officers before submitting any paperwork.
