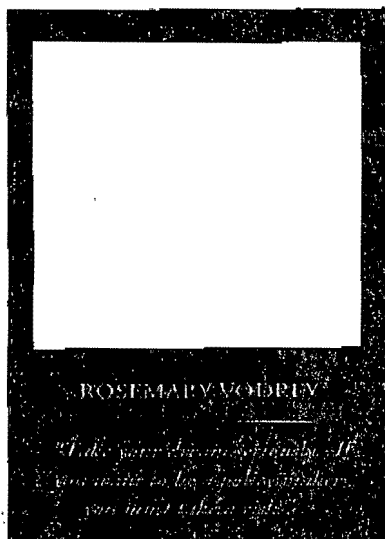

... There was a time in the past when we weren't so sure that we should be taking part." Suddenly she chuckled. "Now I look at the picture on the wall in my office of all the past male Justice Ministers in Manitoba. I'll be the first woman up there."

Rosemary Vodrey, attorney, former school psychologist, radio helpline host, lecturer, and a member of the Winnipeg Junior League, is an example of a community activist and volunteer whose inclination and talent have led to a career in government. And she believes that any woman who desires to shape policy can aspire to a job like hers.

"Take your dream seriously," she advised. "If you want to be a policy maker, you must take a risk"

Taking risks in policy may sound easy but it certainly isn't so for those who live it daily. Carol Rasco, a former member of the Little Rock Junior League, serves as U.S. President Clinton's top domestic policy adviser, one of the most powerful roles in the White House. A frequent spokesperson for the Administration, she works closely with the President on issues like health care, crime, and education. She coordinates the President's Domestic



Shaping Policy at the Top

On the eve of AJLI's biennial Policy Institute (Feb. 2-4 in Washington, D.C.), Review asked League-trained women who are in a position to influence national policy in the Association's four countries to talk about what motivates them, how they wrestle with policy issues, and how they are influenced by individuals and groups.

Policy Council and is a member of the Education Department's National Education Goals panel. She supervises *Ita* Magaziner, the president's troubleshooter on health care policy.

Rasco credits her League experience with introducing her to diverse groups of community activists. She expressed hope that more activists, like League members, will make their voices heard by policy makers.

"I assure you," said Rasco, "if I got some well-reasoned letters on a subject, say on TV violence, I could use them in an argument. But you know who we hear from; people on one extreme or the other, who haven't really tried to form a realistic picture of the situation."

Rasco has been a colleague of the Clintons since 1983. She entered political life seeking opportunities for her disabled son and other handicapped children. She didn't expect that her work would lead to the West Wing of the White House.

"But when you've worked for Bill and Hillary Clinton for ten years, you

don't turn down an offer like this," she observed dryly.

Sue Hildick also received an offer she couldn't turn down. The Northern Virginia League member is Senator Mark Hatfield's (R-OR) Legislative Director. She began her career while in college as a Hatfield intern in the Oregon state office. She later transferred as an undergraduate to Georgetown University, in Washington, D.C., and worked in the Senator's Capitol office, eventually becoming a legislative assistant.

"When I came in, I got to work on the two issues that were left—education and health care," she said, noting they were not front-burner issues at that time. Others in Hatfield's office were more interested in topics like natural resources, a hot issue in Oregon. But Hildick says her issues were Hatfield's as well. The very first project he placed in her hands was the omnibus Math and Science Education Improvement bill. She spent two years researching and writing it and saw it signed into
