# INSTRUCTIONS FOR FAA CENTRAL REGION AIRPORTS DIVISION CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION CHECKLIST

This checklist was prepared by FAA Central Region Airports Division and is intended for proposed projects in the Central Region only.

#### Introduction:

This checklist replaces the previous version of the Categorical Exclusion checklist. Its purpose is to evaluate the appropriateness of using a Categorical Exclusion of airport projects to comply with the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA). The checklist is based upon guidance in FAA Orders 1050.1E and 5050.4B, which incorporate the Council on Environmental Quality's regulations for implementing NEPA, as well as US Department of Transportation environmental regulations and many other federal statutes and regulations designed to protect the Nation's natural, historic, cultural, and archeological resources, etc. The information provided by sponsors and their consultants through the use of this checklist enables the FAA Central Region to evaluate compliance with NEPA and the applicable special purpose laws. All projects proposed for funding under the Airport Improvement Program require environmental processing. The collection of information under the Airport Grants Program is addressed by OMB control number 2120-0569.

### Use:

FAA Orders 1050.1E and 5050.4B provides FAA agency-wide and FAA Office of Airports policies and procedures for compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and implementing regulations issued by the Council on Environmental Quality (40 CFR parts 1500-1508). It is necessary for the airport sponsor to assist the FAA in carrying out its responsibilities under NEPA, which includes determining whether the proposed project requires the preparation of an environmental assessment or an environmental impact statement, or whether the proposed project can be excluded from this requirement. Therefore, it is necessary for the airport sponsor to advise the FAA whether the proposed project falls into one of these exclusions listed in these Orders. Even though the airport sponsor may determine that a proposed project may or may not fall within a categorical exclusion, the FAA may determine that an environmental assessment or environmental impact statement is necessary for a proposed project should substantial controversy on environmental grounds exist or if other extraordinary conditions or circumstances are present that may cause such project to have significant environmental impacts.

Sponsors of airport development projects must demonstrate that the proposed project(s) is/are specifically listed in FAA Order 1050.1E, Chapter 3, and that no extraordinary circumstances exist that warrant preparation of an Environmental Assessment or Environmental Impact Statement. Sufficient documentation will enable Central Region FAA to make that determination. Direct any questions to the Central Region Environmental Program Manager.

Use this checklist in conjunction with applicable orders, laws, and guidance documents and in consultation with the appropriate resource agencies. Sponsors and their consultants should review the requirements of special purpose laws (See 5050.4B, Table 1-1, for a summary of applicable laws). Sufficient documentation is necessary to enable Central Region FAA to insure compliance with all applicable environmental requirements. Accordingly, any required consultations, findings, or determinations by federal and state agencies, or tribal governments, are to be coordinated and completed, if necessary, prior to submitting this checklist to FAA Central Region for review. We encourage sponsors to begin coordination with these entities as early as possible to provide for sufficient review time. Complete information will help FAA Central Region expedite its review. Be sure to attach appropriate documentation, plans, maps, etc., with this checklist.
